

a Meal Reveal

Luke 24:30-35 When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?" They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.

Hello Friends,

This is yet another favorite account for me. Those who were on their way to Emmaus ended adding to the testimony of Christ's Resurrection.

Around Easter we nearly always read about the supporting cast of the Gospels, as the 11 remaining disciples process the news of the empty tomb. Here we have "other" followers of

Jesus, those who aren't named, not identified, just ones who had put their trust in Jesus, and then things seemed to go all wrong. As they are walking home, probably wondering what they were going to do next, a stranger starts walking with them. He talks with them about the Christ (Messiah), and all the Scriptures referring to this promised one, and these disciples encounter a traveling Bible Study, one arguably more inspiring than any study we have ever experienced in a classroom or sanctuary.

I have had a couple people in my entire life who, when they are talking about the Holy Scriptures, my heart burns within me, and joins their passion for it. I hope you have had someone, or some people, who have had that impact on you in your spiritual journey. That being said, as inspiring as that was, and as wondrous as it was for these disciples whose hope had been shattered....that was NOT when they recognized Jesus. Think about that for a moment (or, "SELAH," for those who were present for the "Wrath" sermon :-). While discussing Scripture, and while talking about prophecies concerning HIMSELF, Jesus wasn't recognized. When was he identified? When they sat down to eat, and he gave thanks and broke the bread, THEN they recognized Jesus. Now, let's be honest, we "churchy" folks might assume this was a moment of them celebrating Holy Communion, but all the Scripture tells us is they were at the table (after a journey) and Jesus broke the bread... This wasn't a Passover meal, and the bread may or may not have been unleavened. It was merely 3

persons sharing a meal together, and Christ was revealed. Isn't that amazing?

On April 29, we are going to do something fun, enlivening, and likely somewhat uncomfortable. We are going to have ONE WORSHIP SERVICE that morning, at 10am, and both music styles will be represented. This is planned to

be in the sanctuary, hence the "somewhat uncomfortable." Now, to be clear, this is not a part of a plan to change worship styles or our current services, it is merely an opportunity for us to Worship together as One Body. After the service, I am hopeful the weather will allow us to take a group picture together in front of our building, and then we will share in a meal together in the Activity Center. The meal will be simple, and served by our Good Works Mission Trip Team, but more important, we will get to share together in food and fellowship, and my prayer is that Jesus will be recognized as we bless and break bread together.

While looking forward to the heartburn <u>before</u> the meal, I am, In His Service and yours,
