Cove and Dust

Psalm 103:11-14 11 For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; 12 as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us. 13 As a father has compassion on his children, so the LORD has compassion on those who fear him; 14 for he knows how we are formed, he remembers that we are dust.

Hello Friends

One of the traditions of the Christian Church is to collect the Palm Branches from Palm Sunday, dry them, and then burn them into ashes. Those ashes are then saved until the next year. The palm branches used near the end of Lent of one year are used to usher in Lent the next year. The word

"Hosanna!" is used with them one vear, and "from dust you came, to dust you shall return" is used the next. While we are accustomed to widely different "moods" with these two uses, they are very much communicating the same thing...complete reliance on God.

You may recall me sharing in worship before that the meaning of the word "Hosanna," no matter how festive the music accompanying it, is "Save us." It is a somewhat

desperate cry of God's creation, acknowledging our inability to "save" ourselves, and our complete dependence upon God's grace and love.

The message of Ash Wednesday is one of humility. It is the words of the created acknowledging the Creator, the one who formed us from dust, who breathed life into humanity, and breathes life into our work today.

How interesting it is that Lent begins on February 14th this year. I admit I first was a little put off that our culture's slightly twisted way of remembering St Valentine was in "competition"

with the entrance into Lent, but there is another way to view it. The Season of Lent revolves around the purposeful journey of Christ towards the cross, a journey that could only be accomplished out of love. What if in some way our remembrance of God's love could somehow "redeem" a holiday that sometimes seems to exist so certain companies can profit? What if on Valentine's Day we could remember the love that is the root of all love?

John 15:13 ¹³ Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends.

Christ lived the example for us, an example of love. In fact, though Jesus knew. Paul challenges us with these words:

Philippians 2:5-8 5 Your attitude should be the same as that

of Christ Jesus: 6 Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, 7 but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death-- even death on a cross!

This winter has been a somewhat bitter reminder of our mortality, as we have had to say

goodbye, or maybe, "see you later" to several of our members who have stepped into eternity ahead of us.

From dust we are, and to dust we shall return.

May this season's reminder of our mortality cause us to respond with love instead of hate or fear, and may that love be empowered by God's strength rather than our human frailty.

While embracing the dust, I am, In His Service and Yours.

Pastor Robbie reported that average worship attendance for December was 152 people. The average attendance for 2017 was 163. Grants are being submitted for Lunch Bunch and Bulldog Bags. Bulldog Bags are expanding to 230 students. Joseph is recruiting additional adults to help with the growing youth group. New live feed wiring has been added to allow those to view the service when they can't be in the sanctuary. A "unity" service is being planned for April 29th to combine both worship services.


