ARTING THE YEAR OFF RIGHT



Hello Friends,

As I write this, I am still coming to grips with the reality that 2017 is coming to an end, and 2018 is beginning. It seems recently each year end brings moments of reflection for what has transpired. One of the things we notice as we look back is how it can impact the way we look forward. The growth in our children and youth ministries are impacting plans for 2018.

Psalms 78 encourages us to continue telling our faith stories to the next generation.

Since 2014, possibly earlier, Hoffman has desired to have confirmation classes for our youth. This has proven to be a difficult task, slowed even more by the transition in Youth Ministry Leadership. What I am asking from you is for prayers and support for this work, as well as some information. We have a number of youth who were baptized as infants, and we have youth who have not been baptized but have been growing in faith. We will need to know how many total we will be scheduling. We ALSO are going to need members willing to be a mentors for the several weeks of the classes. but want to make certain how many to plan for. Please know the primary requirements for a mentor are faith, a desire to help our youth, and a common time we can all come together. The youth and mentor will go over various faith topics together, and will likely learn and grow together through this process.



Another aiming point for 2018 comes from Becky Garrett and I having two ideas that are feeding each other. We have been blessed in recent years with very young children, and have tried to respond to the added needs that joy brings. With our limited volunteer resources, it has caused our worship ministry to be reshaped, from having "Children's Church" to having "Preschool Children's Church," simply from the sheer volume of young children. With more infants on the horizon, we are looking ahead to the challenges of young parents,

challenges in providing not only ministry space, but also private space for personal care during worship.

People around the church can tell you I can get too technical when describing some projects, but long story short, we hope to make a live video feed (in HD) of worship available in multiple rooms, expanding from the Nursery and adding other rooms for needs such as infant feedings, a crying room, etc. We may even have an opportunity to have that

live feed available online. With sports and other competitions involving our youth and children, Sundays are becoming more and more scheduled for our families who are committed to the church, but are also committed to supporting their children. Having an online presence to experience worship wherever one is on Sunday may give families spiritual encouragement they need when they can't be present in the sanctuary. It may also encourage those whose health doesn't permit their attendance. Like all ministries, I invite your prayers, but hands and feet may alse be needed to make these ideas come to life. Thank you for all the ways you serve and encourage. 2018 already lookes to be a very exciting year for ministry at Hoffman, and I'm excited to share it with you. May God bless our efforts to faith stories with all generations in West Milton and beyond.

Visitation Team Ministry

Hoffman Church has a Visitation Team ministry that was formed nearly twelve years ago. We visit homebound persons or those who are in retirement or assisted living communities, rehab centers or those who need nursing assistance.

We serve mostly in teams of two visitors and each team usually visits two to three persons per month. We also send cards to people who prefer a card over a visit, or who have moved a distance away. Visits are from half an hour to an hour and are arranged at the convenience of the person visited and the visitor.

The most important mission of the team is to keep our people connected to the church, the members, the activities and their faith. We also offer them communion and pray with them.

United Methodist Men's Glazed Ham Loaf

- 4 Eggs, slightly beaten
- 1 T Grated Onion
- 1 can Tomato Soup
- 2 lbs Ground Lean Pork Sausage (Methodist Men's Sausage)
- 2 C Cracker Crumbs
- 1 lb Ground Cured Ham

GLAZE

- ½ C Brown Sugar
- 1 T Prepared Mustard

Combine eggs, onion, and soup, mix well. Add meats and cracker crumbs, mold into 2 loaves. The last half hour glaze with brown sugar and mustard mixture. Bake at 275 - 300 degrees for 2 hours. Makes 8 servings

Here is the recipe that we use for Easter Sunrise Breakfast.

Egg Sausage Casserole (from Kathy Hayes):

- 2 lbs (makes 5 cups cooked browned) sausage (could do 1 lb each of sage or unseasoned) cooked and crumbled.
- 9 eggs, beaten
- 9 white bread slices, torn into small pieces.
- 3 cups milk
- 3 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 2 tablespoons vellow mustard
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon pepper

Mix well with spoon. Pour batter in the pan (9x13 inch pan). Refrigerate 8 hours (or overnight) for baking. Uncover for the baking. Bake 45-60 min. Oven 350 degrees


