A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Roads and Country Canes to travel...

Luke 14:23 23 "Then the master told his servant, 'Go out to the roads and country lanes and make them come in. so that my house will be full.

Hello Friends,

This passage is from the context of Jesus sharing a story about a man throwing a banquet, who wanted his house full for the celebration. Over the years in Vietnam, the motorcycle rider I have traveled with have shared this Scripture with one another, that there are people our Master wants at the

banquet, but we'll need to go on the back roads, ones out in the country. to make sure all know they are invited.

At the end of 2008. I first heard of the Vietnam United Methodist Church. In 2009 the Shawnee Valley District first sent a mission team over to Vietnam, a "scouting" mission of sorts, one that involved the team traveling by bus to a few locations in the country, including a

couple congregations, and a prospective location for a future ministry training center in Ho Chi Minh City.

The next year, in 2010, I went on my first mission trip to Vietnam, and the rest is history.

Most of us, myself included, did not realize the significance of what we had done until well after we returned home. We started hearing reports of the evangelism taking place after our team left a village, as neighbors were asking church members why Americans had visited their village. The answers to those questions, that we were fellow Christians, led to follow-up questions about Jesus, which then was a catalyst for rapid growth. When talking about this on Sunday mornings, I have sometimes described it as us being "the circus coming to town." The growth of individual congregations then necessitated additional house churches.

and the movement grew from 65 to over 100 congregations within months, necessitating a growth of pastors for more new congregations, and then teams from United Seminary started traveling to Vietnam, as well as teaching via live stream to the Ministry Center as pastors gathered there for instruction.

Now there are over 300 congregations for a denomination that thankfully is no longer being hunted, but still isn't "legal." The work and need for leaders is as great as ever.

Just as we did not know the impact, whether positive or

negative, we would have then, we do not know what impact Ut and Karen's retirement will have on ministry there. If there is truly a change in leadership, we don't know what that will look like, or whether it will be "better" or "worse," as it is so difficult to

quantify those things when leadership changes. All I know is I have travelled with them. laughed with them, have hosted

them in my home as they shared their story with congregations, even roasted marshmallows in our back yard with them, and I know they have poured out all they are for the sake of sharing Jesus with the Vietnamese. I have a respect for them that goes beyond admiration.

It has been my privilege to support these faithful servants. and I appreciate and desire your prayers as I take yet another journey to share joy and love to the pastors and faith siblings in Vietnam. I recall before my arrival to Hoffman you were praying for me, and that trip I had a tumble when I was knocked off the road and hit a concrete pole. I am annually thankful when I remember the protection I had that day. Please keep the prayers coming!

Devotions

Mission/Ministry Update

Becky Garrett spoke about the Children's Ministry. The ministry has grown since she's taken over. Nursery ages range from newborn to 3. If all infants/toddlers are in attendance there is the possibility of 11. All nursery volunteers are safe sanctuary trained, there are always 2 people on duty. In the future a few more volunteers will be needed, so people are not working more than once a month.

Preschool is 3 yr. olds thru kindergarten. During Sunday school there are 7-9 kids and 2^{nd} service has up to 11. There is only 1 adult at this point, possibly need to have a 2^{nd} adult.

Sunday school is 1^{st} thru 5^{th} , with 7 kids and during 2^{nd} service there are 8. During the summer Becky is going to start a new program for Children's Church during 2^{nd} service. It will be for Pre K -5^{th} grade. It will have a super hero theme.

Kids Hope has 7 mentors, 7 students now. The school has asked for more mentors for the 18-19 school year. There will be one student graduating out of the program this year. An end of year party is scheduled for May 24th. Kids Club will welcome back Courtney Wion as teacher for the summer. God's Backyard Bible Camp will involve studies, weekly field trips as well as weekly service projects.

Family Fun Night is scheduled for May 26th. August 16th will be graduation Sunday for Sunday School as well as Blessing of the Backpacks. Right now there are 207 kids, K-5 receiving Bulldog Bags each Friday.

on the Ministry/Mission Report Form. The forms will be distributed in the next couple of months to the various ministry teams for completion.

Given the poor weather and illnesses during the taping, there have been 111 views.







