A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Clearing Paths for the CORD

Isaiah 40:3-5. A voice of one calling: "In the wilderness prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. And the

glory of the Lord will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the Lord has spoken."

Hello Friends I write this having just returned from the Good Works Mission Trip in Athens, Ohio.

Those who have been around church services for a while may recall this passage in the context of

John the Baptist, as the one who prepared the way for Jesus. In the context of this conversation, I would like for us to consider how we join into the work of "preparing the way for the Lord" in the here and now. The landscape is quite different in Southeast Ohio than it is here in West Milton. There are many hills and valleys, and as a result, the roads, the power lines, even the gas pipelines either have to follow the curves of the land, or they have to "cut through" the land. During this week (and for one of our morning devotions) I found myself thinking about the various paths cutting through the countryside of areas such as those in Appalachia.

There were a variety of jobs our team members were involved with this week. One of my tasks was helping to clear overgrowth for the walking trails on the property, which went over creeks, and around the hills by boulders and shallow caves. I was told by the task supervisor that though the paths were worn, it would only take a few weeks for the thorns and vines to take over the path, were it not for the continual foot traffic and the maintainance with trimmers and pruners, the path would only be memory.

I found this information fascinating. I had thought about how

the various missions of the Church "prepared the way for the Lord" by sharing the Good News. I also have thought about how providing for physical needs can possibly open doors to the heart so God can speak.

I must admit in this context I hadn't thought as much about

the maintenance until I spent that day chopping on a walking path. It takes so little time of neglect for the path to become blocked and tangled, and it made me think about the way of the Lord within believers. No matter how long we have been Christians, we still have a need to maintain the "way" of our spiritual journey. I'm sure I don't need to tell you how there are many distractions and "important" things in our lives can



"overgrow" the path.

It is a marvelous gift of God, the relationship offered to humanity through Jesus Christ, but it is not a static relationship. The relationship is intended to be nurtured, and we are in need of continual growth and exercising of our faith. It was joyful work work for the mission team to help prepare the way of the Lord for others in Athens area, just as it is here in West Milton, and around the world. As we continue to provide ways to connect people God loves to the Love of God, I pray we never forget to keep our own pathways nurtured and cared for, so they never become overgrown. One of the great promises from this Isaiah passage is that once the way has been prepared for the Lord, all people will see the glory of the Lord....together. I would love to see that someday.

While keeping the trimmers and pruners ready for my own path, I am,

Board Meeting Highlights

Devotions

Pastor Robbie shared Leviticus 25:35-38. In his work he has discovered that poverty looks different in different parts of our country and in the world. In Leviticus we are reminded to treat foreigners and strangers like our neighbors and our neighbors like we would foreigners and strangers. The passage is full of how we should pass the grace that God gives us on to others.

Mission/Ministry Update

Tina Mathews was a delegate to annual conference which was held at Lakeside this June. The theme was "Be Not Afraid. There Is Enough". There were 2,392 clergy & laity, 411 spouses & visitors in attendance. The Methodist Men reported that they are focusing on Teaching Men 'being a great Man', and teaching men how to treat women without violence. Methodist Women reported that they are working on wage equality for women, Prison Ministries, and diversity. Over \$100,000.00 was collected to be to assist in planting new churches. Hoffman sent \$500.00. Six new churches have been planted with over 800 people attending and 15 baptisms. Based on the finance report there will be a 10% cut in the overall conference budget. The voting was on pensions, health benefit compensation, vacation policy and investment management. Finally, there was discussion of human rights for immigrants and migrants.

Guiding Principles

Leah Blackburn and her husband, Joe, compiled the results from the church survey. Around 40% of adults turned in surveys. The results will be posted in several spots. People are encouraged to talk to Pastor Robbie and/or board members to share their praises or concerns so that we can continue to work together for God's glory.

Tina Mathews will be giving leaders of various ministry/mission teams a form to complete so that we follow our Guiding Principles, and use our gifts and talents to serve each other and the community in a the

resources, support and equipment to fulfill the purposes of your ministry as to be accountable for the activities done as part of the church body.

Finance

The Board is watching finances closely as giving is less than what has been budgeted. So far we are able to pay bills, meet payroll and pay our apportionments.

Trustees

They are getting quotes for carpet in several classrooms and hallways. When one 24-year old air conditioning unit went down, the Board voted to replace 3 aging 24-year old units with more energy efficient heating/air conditioning units. Work in the South Tower will be done to repair/replace windows, screens, wood, and paint soffits.

Pastors Report

Average attendance for April was 176 and for May was 158. The Unity service was attended by 161. Norman did a great job coordinating the music for the service. Pam has been getting Lunch Bunch ready with menus and workers. Courtney Wion will be leading Kid's Club after Lunch Bunch each day. Becky had a successful family fun night and a Kids Hope celebration. This year ended with 7 mentors. The school is requesting mentors for 10 more mentors for next year. Becky and Pam will be asking members from Potsdam and Hoffman to consider mentoring a child. Joseph has been working with Pastor Robbie on the Mission trip to Good Works. Nearly all the youth have completed the confirmation study with their mentors. Three youth were baptized at the river on June 17.


