

2 Corinthians 9:12-13

12 This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of the Lord's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God. 13 Because of the service by which you have proved yourselves, others will praise God for the obedience that accompanies your confession of the gospel of Christ, and for your generosity in sharing with them and with everyone else.

This is yet another week in which a broad spectrum of events are going on behind the scenes. As the Board of Ordained

Ministry work approaches, I have read over a couple hundred documents so far, as I and a few dozen of my colleagues are studying the culmination of multiple peoples' lives in order to make decisions about whether or not to affirm their requests for ordination. These files we read include their autobiographies, their credit histories, even their psychological profiles (I'm sure many would love a

closer look at mine, ha!). In the midst of preparing for this work, I have been a part of services to remember lives cut short. One life was only 15 days young, and the other had decades more time, but in the end there were still many left wanting more time. And then the news came that one of my uncles passed away, and I am unable to attend a family memorial, once again. I think about the many things left unsaid. I think about how many things I leave unsaid.

In Shakespeare's Julius Caesar, the character Mark Anthony shares at Julius' funeral that "The evil that men do lives after them; The good is oft interred with their bones. (buried with them)" This too expresses a realization of too many words and acknowledgments left unexpressed. Over the last few weeks, as the winter weather hit weekend after weekend. flowers of appreciation were anonymously shared to acknowledge and to honor. I found myself slightly jealous, as I feel I have to be careful with public praise. It reminds me of

my early years as a pastor, when I used to call members on their birthdays. That is a wonderful thing to do, so long as you don't forget anyone. Once you do, you realize it is safer to not these extra things, in order not to exclude anyone, and in the process you exclude everyone. I have times I want to express appreciation, but when words seem inadequate, too often my default is to say nothing.

2019 is turning into a year of transitions, as Jim Kinnison steps down from being Chair of Trustees, and Nadine Thompson steps down as President of the Methodist Women. This Spring our Adult Ministry Director, Pam Hitchcock, is

> retiring after many years of serving youth, adults, and I think 6 pastors. All three have served with distinction and honor. All three would rather see the work get done, than get the credit for sufficient recognition? I admit, I not offend, I end up doing nothing. But no. not this time.

There are many worthy of thanks who serve at Hoffman in ways small and large, but I felt these particular transitions are happening a bit too quietly for my liking. Are there words of appreciation you have left unsaid to others? Maybe it is time to share them with those you care about.
