# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Resurrection is for Doubters, too

John 20:24-25


<sup>24</sup> Now Thomas (called Didymus), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. <sup>25</sup> So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe it."

It seems many times in these articles I am in a spirit of "confession." I want to confess today that I like Thomas.

There, I said it. Off to 200 or so households it goes, that I like the disciple that has been paired throughout history with "doubt." Personally. I think Thomas has been the recipient of some bad press through the years, but then again, I just wrote that I liked him, so maybe I'm biased. Then again, name one disciple who didn't doubt? I can't. Even if we were to say Judas escaped this particular

argument, I think doubt had a part in him deciding to hand Jesus over, possibly a doubt that Jesus was the one he hoped Jesus would be. I am aware that as we read Scripture we have to be careful to not insert too much of "our" tone into a particular passage, but some of the accounts Thomas is named in are, in my view, a little humorous, even, dare I say it, sarcastic.


When we think of Thomas, we many times have on our minds his declaration from the Scripture above, followed soon after by Jesus inviting him to do the very thing he had demanded as proof (as illustrated in the dramatic picture I ran across on www.stmarksplumstead.org). However, he was in other Scriptures, too. John 14 is a beautiful passage in which Jesus is trying to calm the disciples' anxiety. He promises to prepare a place for them, so where he is, there they may be. I have read this passage often during funerals and other services of remembrance. The passage includes Jesus saying, "you know the way to the place I'm going." It is so lovely, and yet, it



11:16, as Thomas said to the rest of the disciples, "Let us also go, that we may die with him." My daughter might say Thomas had a little "sass" about him. 😥 Tell me that sarcasm is in my imagination. I have through the years been somewhat insulted by society's caricatures of Christianity, that faith is for the gullible, the uneducated, or for those who check their brains at the door. I say however that

Thomas is one of "us," for he too is one who had difficulty believing in the miraculous. Directly following Thomas seeing, touching, and believing, the Gospel writer continues with these words. John 20:30-31 30 Jesus did many other miraculous signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. 31 But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name. I have many times over the years said (but I didn't coin it), when you see a "therefore," you should see what it is there for. Very few translations include what is clearly in the Ancient Greek early in verse 30, but was there to help faith be passed on to those who would not see, but still believe, because of the doubt of the disciples....because of doubt like Thomas. Belief is what his doubt is there for.





### MAY'S BODY" HEALTH-"BRIDGES"

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I have been reflecting on writing this letter for the past couple of months and yet, I don't know that my words will adequately express everything my mind has been considering as I prepare to retire. Even as I write these few words, salty droplets are trickling down my cheeks... First and foremost, a verse from Paul (slightly paraphrased) comes to mind from 1Thess 1:2: "(I) always thank God for all of you and continually mention you in (my) prayers."

Eighteen years ago when I started as your youth leader under Pastor Rikki Arthur, I told him that I believed that God had called me to Hoffman as a "bridge" for all of the generations, and God was using Youth Ministry as a means to do that.

The first "bridge" was when the youth became involved in many local, regional and international mission projects and several adults stepped up to be chaperones. Then when we developed the Jr. High and High School Discipleship Groups, a few adults stepped up to lead them.

Another "bridge" was being able to preach on those Sundays that Pastor Rikki had Emmaus Walks and I filled the pulpit.

The "bridge" became more defined as the youth graduated and the youth population dwindled, and under Rev. Tim Benkert, Hoffman SPRC allowed my job to evolve into being the Discipleship Director of all the ages—monitoring and starting Sunday school classes, writing curriculum and teaching Confirmation and adult membership classes. When Rev. Tim stepped down due to his failing eyesight, another "bridge" was formed as I assisted the interim pastor, Gail Stevens-Shourds, to connect with the congregation during her 10 months here. We also started doing Prayer Stations for all ages in the Sanctuary during Holy Week.

As Denise Sanderson took over the children's and youth classes and the Clubhouse ministry, the church identified a need for an evening women's Bible study—a "bridge" which was started in 2008 and I will continue to facilitate after my retirement from Hoffman since it is a mixed group from HUMC, Potsdam and other churches.

2008 also saw the beginning of the 5/2 Lunch Bunch when a counselor at the school identified a summer food need for the kids of the community. JoAnn and I spear-headed the first year and 10 adults stepped up to serve!

This "bridge" eventually brought together adults serving as cooks and shoppers; adults teaching Bible stories; and teens serving as mentors to the kids.

Then in 2010 my position changed again, as God's call to become a pastor was fulfilled after five years of praying for His direction. Rev. Kev White was being deployed as a Chaplain with the Army, and his wife, Pastor Stephanie asked if I would consider taking her place at Potsdam UMC. She proposed a shared ministry between our two churches, with me working part-time at Hoffman and Potsdam, and both sharing my salary and benefits. I can only say that without the willingness and generosity of all of you at Hoffman, I would not have been able to answer God's call. Pastor Justin Williams and I started our new pastoral appointments, on August 1, 2010.

Again, a "bridge" developed as I my job transitioned into Adult Ministries Director and I assisted Pastor Justin with membership classes, sermon inserts, assimilation and tracking attendance as the "Open Door" service started. This is when Usher-Greeter training became part of my job description.

Then, in 2015, Pastor Robbie was appointed to Hoffman and with his technical expertise, he has led us into the 21st Century of media. We have worked together to "bridge" our church family to learning opportunities with Right Now Media and recently we were able to build a "bridge" into the community with the Simulcast bringing together 89 people from 14 different churches! The Bible encourages us to be disciples and make disciples and I can look back over these eighteen years and see how I have been discipled by the many pastors and our office manager, and my friend, JoAnn, who will now be the "senior staff member". 

I can also look around and see those for whom I have been honored to be part of their discipling process, one being Becky Circle Garrett who was an eighth grader when I arrived and who now as a staff member of the church has come "full circle" as she disciples the children, adults and community teaching them to love and serve Jesus. I want to thank so many who have reached out with your love, support, encouragement and gifts throughout the years. You will be missed, but held forever in my thoughts, prayers and heart. May God always richly bless you as you continue your journey over the "bridges" of life.


