A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Missions to Mear, far, and Mars?

Acts 1:8

⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Those who read their Newsletters particularly carefully may notice this is the same Scripture as last month's article. Let us be honest, I've probably used that Scripture more than a half dozen times for these articles since I've been here (but I'm not going to look, haha!).

Last month I focused upon the "power" promised in this passage, but this month I would like to focus upon the "witness." This is something near and dear to Hoffman, and in

fact I would say is a distiguishing characteristic of this congregation.

This summer has begun with a flurry of activity, with many things scheduled, and many things unscheduled. In the midst of the aftermath of the tornado destruction, it has been incredibly encouraging to see how our community has responded to help neighbors. I shared with the congregation recently that while I

try to make every community "home" for my family and I, I do not recall being more proud to be a part of a community as I have West Milton these recent weeks. So many churches of our area have been a part of this effort, thank you for your individual efforts, as well. Even throughout the United Methodist Connection we have felt the blessings of community. We recently were blessed to house a disaster relief team from elsewhere in our United Methodist connection, as a team from Tennessee worked at homes on our local roads to join in the efforts. This was a very quiet team, and did not want any extra attention, so we did our best to ablige their request.

There will be local needs connected to the tornado for quite some time to come, and Hoffman intends to be a part of that continuing effort. Sadly, the needs of the rest of the world also are continuing, and thus our regular local missions continues, and ministry continues to reach farther out as well. Lunch Bunch is in full swing, with faces both familiar and new gathering around the tables, and the Zanesville Mission Team is making final preparations for its journey even as I write. While the team is going to help ministries already in place, those ministries are not accustomed to short-term teams coming alongside to help with their work. This has excited those involved in the daily work there and some special projects are planned that need more hands than their own. (but no roofing, yes!)

As you are going to see in other parts of this newsletter, Hoffman will host its first Vacation Bible School in several years. I loved it when Becky told me her rationale for wanting



THE HISTORY OF GRANDMA'S KITCHEN

In 2000, Don and Nancy Allen brought forth the idea of building an activity center on to our church to be a place for programs for our congregation and also for outreach to the community. This vision was underway, getting support and pledges, when Nancy Studebaker volunteered to cook a meal every Wednesday to raise money for the new activity center. Nancy had a lot of help from a relatively small group of volunteers that fixed that first meal for 65 people, in May, 2001.

In 2003, the dinners moved to the activity center and Nancy Studebaker retired as head cook; and Don and Nancy Allen took over serving until December of 2010. Then Phil Blue became the coordinator and Wilma Fryman became the head chef. Due to health reasons, they retired in September and December of 2014. Jim and Marilyn Mitchell and Val McKay took over and have continued to the present.

It was to become an outreach to the community: providing an inexpensive dinner to the people of the community; to make people aware of Hoffman; and to provide a structure for volunteers to positively impact the people of the community. It has continued to be a roaring success, having continued for eighteen years and serving almost 200,000 meals with about 1/2 of the meals are now carried out or delivered to people who need this service. We have served as many as 360 meals in an evening. Today we average about 220 meals every Wednesday with a very diverse menu of different meals. It takes about 35 volunteers each week to put together each meal. They help to plan, shop, cook, prepare, package, serve, wash dishes, deliver, clean up, etc.; some who do not even attend Hoffman. Free meals are provided to those in need; with a suggested donation is only \$7 per meal. The leftover food gets taken to the Troy Family Abuse Shelter and the proceeds are donated to various food related missions.
