Working on the "Toss"

Psalm 78:5-7 He decreed statutes for Jacob and established the law in Israel, which he commanded our ancestors to teach their children, so the next generation would know them, even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children. Then they would put their trust in God and would not forget his deeds but would keep his commands.

We are blessed with the privilege of sharing the teachings of God, as well as the love of God, in muliple ways to multiple children throughout the year, but the summer grants

additional opportunities. The Lunch Bunch not only provides meals for any who come, but also offers a Bible story each day, as well as a rotation of activities, crafts, and music Monday through Wednesdays for 6 weeks, in addition to the Sunday School, Children's Church, Activity Bags, and Ignite Youth on Sunday evenings.

As you read this, our return to Vacation Bible School is already underway, but at "this" moment the building is still undergoing transformation into a space station to prepare for "To Mars and Beyond." It has been a few years, but I have been told the reason we had stopped VBS was due to our lack of children. In recent years, our high number of young children has put it back on our calendar.

While we can't know at this point what the future holds, we can certainly give thanks to God for our blessings of children. I have in years past mentioned that the sounds of children laughing, crying, squeeling, and running are sounds every congregation wants to have heard within its walls. Hoffman's love and support of children are among the many things that align with my heartbeat.


This leads me to the somewhat strange picture on this page. I believe this is the 4th year I have had the opportunity to be a part of our local library's programming to inform and support our local kids (and indirectly their families), and have some fun, too. I think you would be pleasantly surprised how

many from Hoffman have shared their talents with children at these programs. While I don't practice juggling enough for my skill to be what I would like, it seems each year I have something slightly new to share with the kids as I attempt to teach them the basics. I have had a set of juggling balls that can be safely juggled while burning, but they are laborious to light, so I recently added fire torches to my collection, but had not lit their wicks until the night before the juggling program, and thus on the day of the program, I juggled them on fire for the first time in front of 35 chidren...no pressure! Fortunately, all went well, and the kids have memories of the strange man

juggling fire torches (and telling them all the dangers and safety precautions involved). Among the most important things I attempt to share with kids about juggling and life is that our "toss" is very important. Just as doing the scales on the piano is not exciting, it is the key to playing music. The toss in juggling is boring and tedious, but without mastering it one will not juggle well (and certainly will stay away from fire). Similarly, the Old Testament Mosaic Law found in the first 5 books of the Bible, it is tedious, and difficult to "enjoy," but in order for one to fully appreciate the Gift of God through Jesus Christ; to appreciate that Christ is the fulfillment of the law....we owe it to ourselves to have knowledge of the law. and to teach our children it, too. Without the

law, we do not know about sin, and we cannot fathom grace. I am hopeful the weeks we are spending glancing at the law also gives us a chance to see the Good News of God through Jesus the Christ. I have found that in my efforts to avoid sin, I also improve my "toss." Another important element of juggling I try to share with children is that we have to not stop when we drop the balls, because failure is part of learning. Failure is part of life, too. That is where Grace comes in. While always working on my toss, I am,
