

Self-Inflicted Thorns

2 Corinthians 12:7-9 "... in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. ⁸ Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. ⁹ But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me.

By the time you read this, I will have voluntarily gone under the knife for my left knee's ACL to be reconstructed. My first surgery on this knee was in 1991, and I was very disappointed when the doctor told me the repair had not been made because of my young age. He wanted me to wait until I was 30 and "done" with basketball. That wasn't the

case, and so I find myself this year, at the age of 48, and with the Scott family's medical deductible being hit for the first time that I can remember, I consulted with a doctor for surgery.

The back story on this injury is not one that I'm proud of. You may not know it from your interactions with me, but I am more competitive than is

healthy. I was "that" guy who would dive into bleachers, over railings, even over a shopping cart once, to try to put a basketball back into play. Passion has served me well through the years, but in my case, passion usually means my temper is close by. Normally I would cut everyone else around me a break...but I was very good at self-directing my wrath.

It was a late night at the University of Houston, and we had reset the lights multiple times on the courts. One particular fast break, I split the defenders, laid the ball just over the front of the rim....where it hit the back rim and came out. The childlike tantrum against myself that followed hyperextended my left knee, and I fell to the ground. After a few moments I realized my teammates were without a player, so I slowly stood back up, finished the games, and later crawled up the

stairs to my dorm room, naively surprised at the swelling in my knee. I learned later I had damaged my Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL), but as it happened, I ruptured an ankle tendon within a few days after this injury (because I had of course continued playing basketball despite the pain and swelling). I tend to joke that I was nearly indestructible for 18 years, and then my warrantee expired, haha!

That night in 1990 was the last time I lost my temper for the sake of a sport. I guess it is nice to be able to learn something important with only one lesson, but my body has bore this self inflicted "thorn" for 29 years. I will have a new scar, and a ligament from an organ donor. It has been a thorn in my flesh for so long that sometimes I limp whether pain is present or not. I have wondered many times what it would have been like to have not lost my temper that night. I can't live in the

past, of course, but my hope is that over the years I've helped others not take these great games too seriously.

Scholars cannot identify Paul's "thorn" in the flesh, though I'm fairly certain it wasn't caused by his own temper. God has richly blessed me in that I have been very active for a long time despite the damage, and the doctor is impressed

how little arthritis is present.

Given that this surgery is "elective" in a sense, and with all the really serious procedures the congregations members face, I've only communicated this to those I felt needed to know sooner rather than later. My time recovering will not be convenient either for me or for you, but while my time in the office will be more limited, I am as accessible as ever, given the ability to be called, emailed, texted, or facebook messaged. I appreciate and covet your prayers always, and I am hopeful to have a relatively swift recovery, as far as mobility. Athletic activity will have to wait a while.
