

# life set on "full"

John 10:9-10 [Jesus speaking] 9 I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. He will come in and go out, and find pasture. <sup>10</sup> The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

I recall years ago a television show called "This is Your Life." There would be a special quest, and then person after person would be heard by voice only, and after a moment of recognition by the guest, a person known by the guest would emerge from backstage, and share stories and insights from the quest's life.


There is always the tension of life vs death in the work of the church, we are currently in a quiet enough season of funerals that I feel I can mention that

sometimes funeral gatherings have reminded me of that television show. As I have said before, I am an introvert, and at least for my first couple years, waiting in line at a viewing was mainly time standing with strangers, and overhearing the comments from the front of the line. Someone precious from the past was seen for the first time in many years, and hearing the somewhat hurried catch-up as stories and condolences were exchanged, and then the line moved forward, with another unveiling, and more stories. I am starting my 5th year here at Hoffman (I know, right?!), and at this point if I am in line at a funeral viewing, there are enough familiar faces that I am chatting and do not overhear as many of these moments, but I wonder if these moments help reveal what go into a "full" life. Of course a tiny article isn't going to cover it, but it seems the extra effort that goes into making contact with the family of one whom we've shared history communicates that the person who died was a part of our lives in such a way that our lives are somehow "less full" without that person in it.

While holding onto that thought, we presently have various babies and infants cooing and smiling (and yes, sometimes

crying) throughout our sanctuary lately. These babies are surrounded by lives that already had so much to be thankful for, and maybe even could have felt "full" without this new baby, and yet are somehow more complete with that child having arrived. These wonderful young mothers cradling their new additions look down at this child with such an adoration.

> an adoration that comes despite sleepless nights and interrupted conversations, mystery stains to remove. I also think about the mothers who endured much before that particular life arrived, who had earlier endured not being able to welcome a life being knit together in the womb, whether due to stillbirth, or due to miscarriage. These stories are not as public, but those losses were carried in the eyes of those mothers for some time, and as those mothers now hold new life in their arms, the preciousness of that new life



they may have life, and have it to the full" to be true for us? Is the "full" life only the heavenly one that is to come, or is the "full" life for here, too? Of course you already know our fullness isn't about possessions or bank accounts but what does it look like to have Jesus' words ring true? I won't pretend I will fully be able to explain it, but I think of the mothers who are looking upon their beautiful children, and yet still remember the ones they never really got to meet... They know how precious THIS child is, in part because of the one not here. I think of all those who never get to be parents...

For all of those, and also for the rest of us, my prayer is that hopefully without tragedy we can see the gift of each day, that each and every person we come in contact with is precious, and is one who Christ was born and died for. Who can we add to our lives, that our lives and theirs are more "full" because of each other? Who can we introduce to the gate that is Christ? While thankful for those who included me in their lives, I am,

# Board Meeting Highlights

#### **Devotions**

#### Finance Report for July

Approved and Accepted. Note that some large occasional bills along with 4 Sunday vs 5 Monday (paydays) caused shortfall in income vs expenses.

## Pastor's Report

Average attendance for July was 144. Pastor Robbie shared that some attendance numbers run the risk of not being quite as accurate with recent changes. Physical count from ushers is more important than ever.

Staff updates include a successful summer for Becky's Children's Ministries, particularly our first VBS in over 10 years.

Joseph has done a good job of inviting new faces to IGNITE, and time will tell if those connections grow.

Pastor Robbie completed required "one on one" meeting with Rev Lybarger, and was in the quarterly Superintendency Meeting at the District Office. He is attending the West Ohio Conference's first REF retreat, which will be required of all clergy in the conference over the next 8 years.

"THEREFORE, What's it There For" is the next worship series.

## Board Study

"7 Practices of Effective Ministry," by Andy Stanley. Focus this time was on "Insider" vs "Outsider" thinking. One important reflection from the board was that as welcoming as Hoffman is to new faces, once those new faces get involved beyond the surface, there is a barrier of "always done this way." New voices offer new ideas.

#### Mission and Ministry

Highlighted was the ministry of serving at the computer during worship, advancing slides. There is a pressing need to add more volunteers, as there are regulars scheduling time out of town. This is not incredibly complex, and does not require great computer knowledge, but is extremely helpful on Sunday mornings. As it is of course difficult to ask a member to give up full participation in worship in order to fulfill this need (as is happening now), initial brainstorm was to see if any 2<sup>nd</sup> service persons might be able to serve. With the high number of young children, this could be challenging.

#### Trustee Report

\$36,770 is in the capital fund. The school bricks have been used on a variety of projects, including as decoration around contemplation bench, and as foundation for the waste receptacles outside the Activity Center. Tuck pointing on the west side of the church is being performed by Bruns in hopes of eventually sealing the brick and eventually stopping the leaks around windows in two offices. After Towers roofing is completed, bell tower floor will be sealed, and work can commence on the ceilings of the tower rooms

Non agenda discussion included general conversation of security. Pastor Robbie mentioned the trustees have had the most conversations around it, and some subtle changes have been made on Sundays to try to help us feel more secure. A warning that a church whose strength is in being welcoming can quickly lose that "feel" while trying to be "secure." General thoughts were to find ways to communicate to congregation (but not in worship) what steps have been taken, or explored.

The devotions will be led by Dick Martens at next meeting, which is scheduled for September 19.

Hello to all. My name is Marijo Schlecht. I have been attending the second service at Huffman for several months. I wanted to offer to share some stories that are close to my heart of the persecution of our brothers and sisters in other countries. The gospel is spreading although many times there is a cost, as our Lord told us there would be. May these stories strength our walk as we keep others in our prayer life. The ministry is called: The Voice of the Martyrs.

If you are not familiar with this ministry, it was started by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand. Richard had made a historic speech in front of the Communist Party that invaded Hungary, France and surrounding countries. Wurmbrand and his wife Sabina had already been risking their lives feeding those starving and spreading the Gospel of Jesus to many. The night of his speech he declared the Communist Party would never allow the Gospel to be heard as in countries before, they had killed thousands of Christians. This infuriated the Russians. Four years later, Richard was arrested by the secret police. His torture for the Gospel had begun. It lasted fourteen years in the horrendous underground prison, with to many beatings to keep count of. Many believers were there, many died, many others came to know the Lord. Their story is beyond incredible. Today. Voice of the Martyrs ministers to thousands around the world who suffer persecution to spread the Gospel. I have personal been so touched by stories of our brothers and sisters who give up everything for the glory of God. Each month I will report a country or family that needs prayer. This month please remember Pastor Pierre Oult's family and congregation. This pastor had served for forty years. On April 28 of this year Pastor Pierre, his son and other members were killed one at a time for refusing to follow Islam. Earlier in the year the Pastor was asked to leave. He quoted" I would rather die for my faith than leave the community I have been serving for forty years." This town is in the province of Burkina, West Africa. Until he returns, Marijo Schlecht
