A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Dust, Ashes and ... Snow?

Galatians 3:27-28 ... all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

Tuesday morning I stepped out of the parsonage garage armed with my trusty shovel, a "pusher" type that had been effective on many snowfalls over the years...but Monday night's snow was a deeper and heavier snow than we normally see. It did not take long for my "pushing" efforts to be in vain, as the mountains I had created on all the edges were no longer able to have shovelfuls "pushed" up them. I had to start scooping and throwing. Today my body is feeling it.

Even as I was huffing and puffing along, I could not help but notice how lovely everything appeared. Why, even my old Grand Am looked better now "dressed" with this pristine layer of white covering its dinginess and its dings. I could no longer see all the blemishes as it was entirely cloaked in white.

In Genesis 3 we are reminded that after "the fall" God did not abandon Adam and Eve. While their actions had a consequence of not being permitted to enter the garden, thus losing access to the fruit of the tree of life (essentially becoming mortal...talk about a superfruit!), God still cared for them, and "clothed" them.

Even though the consequences of sin brought a sort of death sentence on humanity (from dust you came, to dust you shall return), we need those constant reminders of God's everlasting love and faithfulness. Even as God was punishing Adam and Eve, God was clothing them...blood was shed in order for their shame to be covered, however. Instructions were given to the nomadic people of God the process of shedding blood annually for the sake of paying the penalty of sin. When Christ came, however, God started fitting humanity

with new garments not made from sin, and not produced by the shedding of animal blood.

As the Galatians passage reads, all who are baptized into Christ have been *clothed with Christ*. This is crucial, as it means this gift of God, the one that is by grace and not by works, is one in which God, who knows all our dinginess; all our dings, chooses to see Christ's righteousness instead of our own, which as you likely know is as *filthy rags*. We are clothed in splendor, clothed in righteousness. But before we start allowing our minds to focus on "skin deep" beauty, thinking I'm only talking about God washing the outside of us to "look" the part, consider this...



We teach in Wesleyan theology that God pursues us before we can ever accept God's grace. That pursuit has been called Prevenient Grace. Once we accept that gift of love, we receive what has been called Justifying Grace, which is when we are clothed in CHRIST'S Righteousness. The next work to happen, also a gift of the Divine, is Sanctifying Grace. One of the ways it is explained is to say that God takes

up residence within us through the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit begins a work of transformation inside us. John Wesley preached and believed it is possible for the Holy Spirit to complete that work even before our earthly body perishes. That the Righteousness that is seen on the outside through Christ's wardrobe starts becoming reality from the inside out. The timing of this can be instantaneous, or can progress slowly over time. In Theological terms, the "Imputed" righteousness declared upon us through Christ will become "Imparted" righteousness through the work of the Holy Spirit. We become a new creation inside and out. I pray this is a work you have seen in your life. While trying to appreciate the snow cloak through the soreness of muscles, I am, In His Service and yours,

Pastor Robbie has been working on various projects, connected to tech, to benefit our worship service including connecting the service to YouTube. Pulpit fill planned January 31 due to Robbie's responsibilities with the Board of Ordained Ministry. Bishop Palmer will preach a recorded sermon on Jonah 3. Chris and Jenna Moran joined as members.

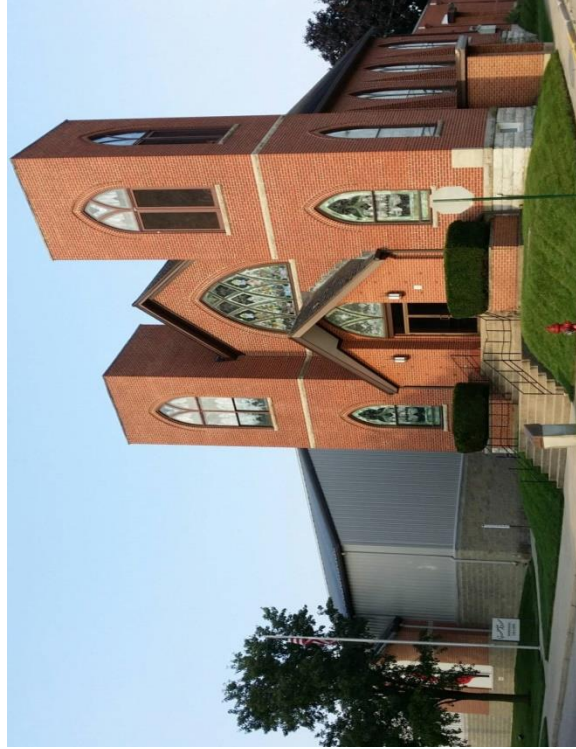
