A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Choosing Gratitude

1 Thessalonians 5:15-22 Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always try to be kind to each other and to everyone else. 16 Be joyful always; 17 pray continually; 18 give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 19 Do not put out the Spirit's fire; 20 do not treat prophecies with contempt. 21 Test everything. Hold on to the good. 22 Avoid every kind of evil.

I was touched recently as a member shared an internal struggle with regard to health. There were things that were not right, and there was an ever present frustration with waiting for health situations to finally straighten out...and at the same time there was a friend who had the same condition but had died with very little warning. There was still the frustration, but there was also great thankfulness for

the opportunity to have the frustration to live with. I remember thinking to myself, "yeah, it has felt something like that." I have found myself struggling to give thanks in all circumstances. Maybe you have, too. Some of these circumstances have cost time, resources, relationships, even lives. How on earth can I give thanks in all circumstances? The short answer is that regardless of the circumstance, there is always much to be thankful for, even in the valley of the shadow of death. (talk about an understatement of easier said than done!)

So much of our current reality is not what we wanted or chose, but was forced upon us. The last 17 months have included so many health challenges for the world, and have forced many changes in how we interact with the world around us. It has been an incredibly frustrating time, even an angry time. We certainly are free to be angry, even though sometimes I admittedly have felt I'm not free to be. But just as I am tempted to give someone a piece of my mind that I likely cannot spare. I remember Paul's instruction in Galatians.

Galatians 5:13-14 "You... were called to be free. But do

not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love. The entire law is summed up in a single command: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'"

Last month I wrote of difficult decisions and circumstances around the church, and this month I find myself reminded to choose to be thankful for all the things I so easily overlook, as well as for the opportunities these challenges have brought.



The picture I have included this month is a view of the upper stained glass windows in our south tower. They likely have been viewed from the inside by only a handful of members over the last 50 years, maybe even the last 100 years. This window refurbishment work we were somewhat forced into has granted us a visual of the inside of the tower that has lifted spirits in ways words cannot describe. The workers who removed thousands

of pounds of concrete and plaster that had been suspended in the tower over the "welcome center" told us there were several chunks that would have started falling through the ceiling in the relatively near future. The online streaming some of you have heard me complain about has given access to worship to those without the option of attending in person.

There is much to be thankful for in a season full of challenges. We are even thankful to be free to choose whether to be thankful or not. Look at that first Scripture again. Be Joyful...Pray...Give Thanks. 3 "simple" steps to fullfill God's will in Jesus Christ. I hope to encourage all who will "listen" to keep on keeping on. May it be that all of us strive to fulfill God's law through our love. Thank you for the many expressions of love, care, and prayer shared during staff appreciation month. I am terrible at properly responding to such acts, but I cherished each one. Have a blessed and joyous Thanksgiving.


