#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

GKLT

Nehemiah 4:17 17 Those who were rebuilding the wall and those who carried burdens took their load with one hand doing the work and the other holding a weapon.

I have been hearing a word in some conversations and even on television programs that I had not noticed in a long time. GRIT. I recall there being a publication that would arrive at my parents' home with that same title. I can't claim to have read it, but my assumption was that it carried within it stories about various ways in which people had overcome adversity of various kinds by way of determination...a sense of "never give up." Grit to me is about being tough enough to take a few hits and still press on. For those who enjoy Rocky movies, it is

about getting back up when life knocks you down.

I recall while serving on an Advisory Board for M-U School District, an open discussion about what things we want students to learn (besides facts and knowledge) occurred, and I remember one of the recurring

words was "grit," accompanied by the question of how does one "teach" that. Certainly it is learned, but is it taught? There is almost no discussion about it that can avoid dealing with adversity, with setbacks, with challenges, even failure. I recall the discussion turning to how to set up students in such a way that they learn that things don't come easy, that failures lead to successes, that being able to have "grit" or resilience is necessary to overcome challenges is a necessity of life. Grit.... functions at its best when situations are at their worst.

You are likely getting a feel for where I'm going here, but I still will refer to the Nehemiah passage. The book of Nehemiah records the events that led to a cupbearer to a king to be granted permission to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem, and the challenges that were faced and overcome in order to complete that work in an amazing amount of time. There were rumors and threats of attack that at one point forced Nehemiah to instruct the workers to have their weapons their with their tools, so they would be ready to fight at a moment's notice. If they only focused on their work, they would not be ready for an

attack, but if they only focused on the defenses, the wall rebuild would never be completed. They somehow had to do both.

I write this near the end of Vacation Bible School, even as mandatory mask orders for Ohio go into effect "tonight." This season of COVID-19 has disrupted life in ways that can't fully be fleshed out now, but even as we engage in a "battle" to keep everyone as safe as possible; there is still work to be done to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. It has been one of my most difficult times in ministry, for though I have a reputation for technology knowledge, I knew NOTHING about streaming worship through a computer 4 months ago. I am thankful it is working as well as it is, though I

am aware not everyone has that option (we are still making DVD's, but we need to know who wants them (2)). We are doing the best we can in a difficult situation to adapt with all the tools available to us. My appreciation goes out to all who

are engaging in work for the Kingdom of God in so many ways, including those who worked very hard to make certain there is some sort of Vacation Bible School for our youngest to still receive discipleship instruction. The "training" this year is on the armor of God, but I love the reminder in midst of the passage.... Ephesians 6:12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.

Our struggle, our battle, is not against flesh and blood, not against people, for the people are why we exist. In this season, we not only struggle against the spiritual forces of evil, we also struggle against the dangers of COVID-19...but the building work still must continue...with all the tools we have at our disposal. While fighting and building with the Word of God...and some new computer knowledge, I am, In His Service and Yours,

#### Mission and Ministry:

We discussed 3 church events and ministries.

VBS July 19-23, Becky proposed a hybrid format: families will come together in the activity center, parents will stay; Openings, Songs, Bible Story and the Science experiment will be presented to families from the stage; crafts/snacks will be packaged for families to take home; church discussed and agreed with this format; options for offering combo streaming- private facebook group or zoom webinar. Annual Picnic 8/9, to be held with changes including: no access to inside of the Black's home.and food change. A port-a-let and changing tent will be set up. Meat and dressings for sandwiches will be offered and served. Attendees bring table service, sides, drinks and desserts for their own family.

#### Pastor's Report

Average attendance for May was 133. Streaming numbers have slightly decreased, but.it is still difficult to have an accurate report. Robbie has printed instructions for "streaming service setup" Pulpit fill planned for Aug 2, Tom Weeks. Robbie will still be planning for possibly another day of rest with another streaming video option.

#### **Finance**

The church had a good month in May. Currently we have 8 x the weekly need in reserve. The budgeted moving allowance fund has reached \$5000. The board approved to continue the \$1000 per year to increase the fund to \$7000 for managing increased costs.. The "Revitalization Project" grant has been utilized and we will need to find other sources for the items that were paid for from this grant.

#### **Trustee Update**

The board approved a new copier purchase for \$5000 with the same service agreement.LED lights were purchased for the activity center for \$1680, about half of previously quoted cost, Towers rooms are still leaking. The roofing company states the brick needs to be sealed. The last 2 of 3 AC units in activity center, from 2003 (typical lifespan 15 years), need replacement- \$16000 was approved. Plan to paint old garage later this year.
