A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Do Not Be Afraid

Luke 2:10 But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people.

Some of you heard me speak around this passage back in July, and will again on Christmas Eve. In this season I am giving myself a bit of hazard relief (golf term!), for I believe this part of the Christmas message may bear repeating, particularly as *this* season endures.

Throughout the accounts of Christ's birth, we see the message of "Do Not Be Afraid" given to Joseph, to Mary, and to the Shepherds. From the Old Testament through the Good News and the New Testament, the message "Do not be afraid" is repeated over and over and over again. Some online encouraging memes report there are 365 such admonitions in Scripture (there may be just a few less or more, I don't have the focus to count them all (3)). 2020 may


require every sing one of them. I think by and large there are very few in the Hoffman family who are "afraid" of the pandemic in particular. Many are fine knowing their heavenly home awaits, however the manner of entrance. That being said, many of us are concerned for how getting sick could impact others if we were to inadvertently spread the virus to them. At the the least they could be inconvenienced, but then all the options for the worst-case scenarios come into play. This is where I reside, I admit. I am around a variety of people for multiple events, from weddings to funerals to our worship services and other casual events, and I do not want to be the reason the disease comes to the home of someone who is at more risk than I.

The Christmas Story includes exhortations to Not Be Afraid as well as actions of prudence. Despite these persons told this message of fearlessness, there are also actions of caution recorded, from the magi going home in a different way to avoid Herod, to Joseph taking his wife and newborn Christ child and moving to Egypt until Herod had died (actions prescribed by the same source as the "fear not"). Just because they were not in fear did not mean they purposely went where the danger was. To connect it to my firefighter experiences, I was relatively fearless while in a burning building, but once my chief determined it structurally was losing stability, I did not stay in the building, despite my lack of fear. I am convinced that we can live without fear and also be prudent and cautious...our way of living out doing all the good we can, to all the people we can, in all

the ways we can, as long as ever we can.


In March I "set my jaw" that we were going to have our normal services broadcast at our normal times. Early on I had read that having routines stay similar to the usual was helpful for our mental and emotional health. Being stubborn has served me well most of my adult life, but I admit as this continues I am aware of a mental

tiredness trying to settle in. Recently I too needed to have a COVID test, and I found my mind racing through contingency plans for the church or my family if the virus truly "came home." By now a number of our Hoffman family and relatives have already struggled with the virus, with varying degrees of discomfort and severity. At this point the congregation has been spared deaths directly caused by COVID-19. Having said that, I am certain the virus has caused other harm, possibly even through the distancing that helps keep us safe.



This year during Advent we will share a worship series called "The Glory of Christmas." It is produced by "The Skit Guys," and focusses on characters around the manger, with video illustrations that allow us to smile while also making a point. I've made no secret of my belief that humor serves as "shock absorbers" for the challenges of life, and as this journey through COVID continues, I feel we need all the shock absorbers we can get. Lord willing, I am hopeful we can share additional smiles in our shared worship journey along the way. While looking ahead to celebrate anew the arrival of Immanuel, God With Us, I am,

Pastor's Report

The Pastor's report was given for September. The average attendance for both services combined was 105. The Towers report breaks down the services by service time, both online and in person. Robbie has difficulty getting an accurate number for attendance, as Facebook analytics are not useful with actual numbers of service watchers. He is still working through the best technology set up for both services, being mindful of several needs of our congregation. Joann is preparing reports and paperwork for the Charge Conference. Becky planned a "Family Fun" night Oct 30 and "Trunk-or-Treat" Oct 31. Due to COVID, Bulldog Bags food is being delivered, stored and packed at the church. Joseph is leading Ignite youth with Middle and High School on alternating weeks. Meetings have been held outside, more discussion and planning will take place prior to any indoor meetings. The river baptism went well for Kat. Robbie will be presiding over 2 Charge Conferences: 10/20 and 11/15. He will have one or two more to schedule. There has been a good response to directory pictures. Robbie has a plan for more picture memories to be included in the directory. There will be an app feature for use by the congregation. Charge Conference 11/19 at 7:30, Rev Jon Ferguson presiding elder for our Church Conference.

Finance

The finance report for September was reviewed and accepted. We are considering changing banks due to no local branches of Fifth Third. September giving was low, comparatively. There is an \$8000 increase in endowment fund due to a market adjustment. "Invitation to pledge" letter went out to the congregation with 32 pledge cards being received. This represents 59% of revenue for this year from pledged donations. A new "2021 Proposed Budget" was available for review. Weekly need has only gone up 0.6%. If we can maintain our current course, we will have a year similar to last year. Total budget increase is very small.

Stair landing in basement is in process, carpet and rail to come.

The boiler is outdated. Recent repair this week was \$2100. Trustees are investigating high efficiency boiler replacement for next year The Stained Glass Window restoration Project breakdown was reviewed and approved for publication in the Towers. Kinnison Memorial tree, painting the garage and hail guards are outstanding projects.

At the time of publication, the intention is to continue in person worship, but obviously these are times when we should be attentive and cautious. Of course we know that if we do not feel well we should not be in public gatherings, but also try to be aware if you feel you have been around someone who puts you at risk of carrying the virus elsewhere. Safe distancing and masks through the entire service are strongly recommended. We continue to offer DVD recordings of the 9:00am service and are mailing those as requested. -rs
