persons come through in high pressure situations.

The prophet Jeremiah received this Word from the Lord while people were displaced by a foreign power. Even in the midst of that horrible situation, God was reminding the prophet and the people was that He was still present with them, no matter their present circumstances. Seems

like that message is still in the air around here...Emmanuel, God With Us. No matter what the coming year brings, God is already there, even without hoverboards.

I have to admit that this fall has been one of my most difficult, and in the midst of feeling like there was no way to get everything done, the grace and support shared through cards, conversations, and gifts have been precious, and each sharing has been cherished. Thanks to our Grandma's Kitchen volunteers for your help this past year. This "program" doesn't work without all the volunteers who give their time each week. We served a total of 7468 meals in 33 weeks with 31% of the meals going to those who are in need. We also had 66 different volunteers—and subs—serving in six different time slots doing jobs such as peeling potatoes, baking cakes, cutting fruit, making Jello, packing carryout containers, packing and delivering meals, cooking, seating guests, serving salads, desserts and beverages, bussing tables, doing dishes and taking care of leftovers. Your many hours of work (2702!) are much appreciated.

Thanks, also, to our loyal supporters who dined with us this year as you provide the financial basis for this program. We love seeing you week after week and hope that you will come back next year.

Hello friends. Let me begin with praising our Lord and Savior for his continued love and hope as we try to persevere in an ever fallen world. Let us also find hope in this new year as I report the testimonies of brothers and sisters around the world who are standing tall for Jesus in ways we could not imagine. This month I want to focus on is Nigeria. Northern Nigeria has been brutalized since 2011 from the Boko Harem , an extreme terrorists and nomadic militant group. More than 35,000 people have been killed, and many Christian are their target. The fighting has left 10,000 Christian widows and thousands of orphaned children. Many women and children fled to the brush countryside as their homes were destroyed and their husbands killed.

I want to mention one such widow named Alice, who in 2001 fled for her life and was left to raise her children in a hallway of and elderly man's home. After weeks of depression, she asked God for wisdom. Slowly she began to work odd jobs and grow crops only to have the crops destroyed in 2015 by Fulani militants. VOM volunteers then found Alice and helped provide living expenses. VOM workers also helped restore Alice's wavering faith. Incredibly in 2018 Alice's new village was again destroyed. That night an 86 year old man sheltered about 200 Christians in a mosque saving their lives.

But there is an amazing ending. Alice can now see how God saved her from each catastrophe, she has quoted scripture, "God said this would happen and the Lord gives and takes." God has also removed any anger or revenge feelings for her persecutors. Alice states again "we should all watch and pray because the bible said this persecution would come." I think this is real faith, and may you be inspired as I am by our sister Alice.

United Methodist Men's Glazed Ham Loaf

4 Eggs, slightly beaten

1 T Grated Onion

1 can Tomato Soup

2 lbs Ground Lean Pork Sausage (Methodist Men's Sausage)

2 C Cracker Crumbs

1 lbs Ground Cured Ham

GLAZE

½ C Brown Sugar

1 T Prepared Mustard

Combine eggs, onion, and soup, mix well. Add meats and cracker crumbs, mold into 2 loaves. The last half hour glaze with brown sugar and mustard mixture. Bake at 275-300 degrees for 2 hours. Makes 8 servings.

Egg Sausage Casserole (from Kathy Hayes):
This is the recipe that we use for
Easter Sunrise Breakfast.

2 lbs (makes 5 cups cooked browned) sausage (could do 1 lb each of sage or unseasoned) cooked and crumbled.

9 eggs, beaten

9 white bread slices, torn into small pieces.

3 cups milk

3 cups shredded cheddar cheese

2 tablespoons yellow mustard

1 teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon pepper

Mix well with spoon. Pour batter in the pan (9x13 inch pan).
Refrigerate 8 hours (or overnight) for baking.
Uncover for the baking. Bake 45-60 min. Oven 350 degrees.
