





A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR COMMUNION... of Saints

Romans 8:38-39 38 For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, 39 neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

"What a fellowship, what a joy divine, leaning on the the everlasting arms; what a blessedness, what a peace is mine,

leaning on the the everlasting arms..." These are the first words of one of my favorite songs of the faith (granted, I have several "favorites"). As a child I probably liked this one because of the pace we sand it at my home church, and I doubt many would say the UM Hymnal is "full" of songs with pace. (3) That being said, the words of this hymn are among those that have encouraged me over the decades. I'm aware that we can sing this with a very individual focus, that the "fellowship" is just about Jesus and "me," but normally we speak of fellowship with a larger audience in mind....that all of us with voices joined proclaim a fellowship together with the

everlasting arms of God. It is kind of a "I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together" moment, in which the Church of Jesus Christ makes a singular declaration as the Bride of Christ, a singular "fellowship" to share in the "joy divine" where "peace is mine."

Fellowship has had its challenges in recent months, as we have had to "settle" for alternative forms of it, be it through online interactions, phone calls, or other forms safely "distanced." By and large, we have not liked it. We want to be together in the ways that we remember. It is true of this present season, as we are able to gather in the sanctuary together, but differently, and as we gather we notice who is not with us, whether due to additional health risk factors, or whether they have joined the "Church Triumphant" I keep writing about in the emails.

CELEBRATE JOYFULLY

This brings me to an important aspect of All Saints' Day, or All Hallow's Day, if you prefer the older language. We have too many reminders that life is fragile; that we are never guaranteed to see each other in person again. We also have reminders in our faith that we too can join the Church Triumphant if we persevere. On this side of eternity, we are called the Church Militant, for we are still in the struggle against the powers of darkness in This world. We continue that struggle until our last breath. Have you noted what is the same

> about both "sides" of eternity? "Church." There is one Church. Saints redeemed by Christ are either in one or the other, but all are saints, and all are the Church. This is where it gets cool. The Apostles Creed affirms that we believe in "the Communion of Saints." Those few times we do share it in worship, we may rush by it, for it is near the end of the creed, but it matters. The Communion of Saints is less about sharing in bread and juice, and more about sharing fellowship...a fellowship not separated by race, or by politics; not separated by geography: not separated by time....not even separated by death. Let that sink in for a moment. There is one Church that gathers to

celebrate and worship the God of the living...those living on the Church Militant side of eternity, or those living on the Church Triumphant side of eternity, and we share in <u>that</u> fellowship together. This fellowship also looks different, and stretches beyond social distancing boundaries, beyond geography, race, even beyond the boundaries of time and space, life and what we think of as death. I pray we continue to press on in the power of the Holy Spirit as we hold together our fellowship in all the forms available to us. Our physical altar tables are so tiny compared to the table God offers for all the saints past and present to gather in fellowship together. While trying to be aware of the "hugs" of the cloud of witnesses, I am,

Pastor's Report

The average attendance for August was 34 in person, 74 online. Norman has been instrumental in the success of Sunday services including PowerPoint for the services and in the recordings. The nursery is now open on Sundays during second service. Becky has plans for a "Family Fun" night and a "Trunk-or-Treat" during October Ignite small group meetings have begun every Sunday, alternating weeks with Middle School and High School students. Average attendance is 7. Baptism for Kat Granado is Sunday September 20th. Pastor Robbie will be presiding over Church/Charge Conferences this year for 5 congregations in Darke County. He has been invited to serve another 4 years on the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry.

Finance

The finance report for August was reviewed and accepted. Weekly need \$4824, this month giving \$4280. We are currently operating at 2 weeks under budget. An "invitation to pledge" letter will be sent to the congregation with the pledge cards next week with request for return by October 8. 2021 Proposed Budget was available for review. The new category of "Media Subscriptions" includes subscriptions to RightNow Media, Sharefaith, Optisigns, 1 and 1. The budget as presented with 2% staff salary increase and the understanding of a few line items listed as estimated will be updated by the time of charge conference was approved.

Nomination

The following motion made and approved: "Due to the 2020 COVID crisis, the current terms of office expiration for our Church Board be extended by one year. The exceptions to this motion would be that the Chair will take the Vice Chair position for one year, and the Vice Chair will as scheduled take the Chair position, but for 3 years."



Hoffman Stained Glass Window Restoration Project

The trustees noticed that Hoffman's stained glass windows are in dire need of restoration. They contacted several stained glass restoration companies and requested quotes. The companies noted that our storm windows are not vented, the stained glass is sagging to the point where there are gaps in several places where the glass has separated from the frame and lead cames, and some of the saddle bars are broken. There are 18 stained glass windows in the church, ranging in size of 70" x 70" to the large 116" x 128" window above the front door that is in the worst shape. The glass has sagged so much that there are gaps between glass and the window frame.




One company proposed removing and restoring all windows and replacing the storm windows with Plexiglass mounted in custom vented aluminum frames. The other company proposed removing and restoring all windows and venting the existing storm windows. The trustees recommend going with the second company at a significantly reduced cost since the existing storm windows are functional and only need to be vented and painted.

The trustees asked the church board to approve a capital fund drive to obtain pledges for 50% of the project cost before proceeding with the restoration. Please consider pledging a regular gift to the stained glass window project or sponsoring the total cost of restoring a window. A memorial plaque recognizing the sponsor of the window will be added if desired. Please let the church know which window you want to sponsor. The list and cost of each window restoration follows:
