A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Resurrection

Mark 16:6b-8

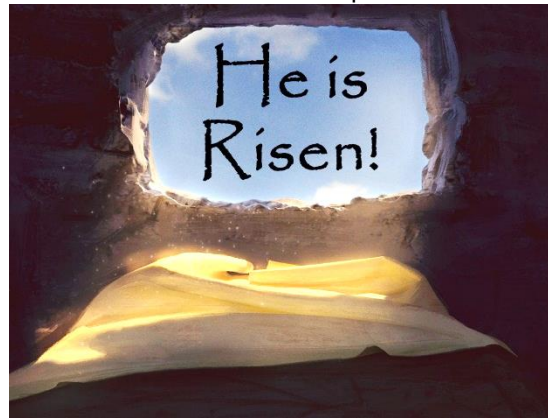
"You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. 7 But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.'" 8 Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.

Of all the Gospels, Mark is the shortest, and it is believed to have been the first one written. The first chance tell the Good News in written form, and the women hear the message from the angel, and flee from the empty tomb, telling no one. The next account in Mark, Jesus Himself appears to Mary Magdalene, and afterward she goes to tell the disciples...but they do not believe her...Jesus then appears to two others, likely the Emmaus travelers in Luke's Gospel, and when they come back to report the Resurrection to the others, but again met with disbelief. It doesn't exactly sound like the beginning of a movement of God, does it? And given Mark's brevity, it has the nuance of a band aid being ripped off.

These persons had watched Jesus' arrest and execution, and had a clear understanding of death. They knew this was the end of what they had experienced up until then. The idea of resurrection was not good news, at least not yet. Bewilderment and fear kept the disciples from being able to fathom what they were being told.

You see, resurrection doesn't always feel like good news. Sometimes we are in "situation:rock bottom" and are not ready to hear or risk hoping. There are also times when we are hanging onto what has us stuck, and we sometimes have to metaphorically let death come in order to see new life. What I mean is, sometimes a new beginning cannot happen without an end to something else. I have by now watched this play out a number of times. Other than my own story, one of the most

memorable moments was when I prayed with someone that God would close the doors that needed closed. Within days the franchise company unexpectedly removed that person's license...I thought I was going to be sick when I first received the news. In the end that door slamming shut was the opportunity to walk through a different door. He is currently a UMC pastor in Gallia County, and recently I have learned he has been a catalyst for another person whose faith went to another level, and who also will begin serving as a part time pastor this summer.



In both cases, the ending of one journey was uncomfortable, even painful, but their "resurrection" on the other side causes them to be thankful for the end of the previous journeys, despite the pain, for they would never have known the joy of the present journey without the previous journey ending. I have experienced and heard this process repeat enough times to know that this is one of the many ways that resurrection has been and can be lived out.

Lent is when many people of faith deny themselves practices or things that could potentially become obstacles to faith, if given too much opportunity. Often I have heard accounts of Easter coming and people then choose to go forward in life without those things they have abstained from during Lent. This is another form of walking into a "new" life after a challenging season of loss through self denial.

I of course am not saying that everyone who feels "stuck" should change jobs, or extend forever your Lenten sacrifice. Instead, I am reminding that new life and resurrection is not all rose petals and sunlit paths. Sometimes, even many times, our fresh start and new life comes just after a point of great pain, loss or sorrow, just as Mark records. The Good News often is experienced in our lives on the heels of broken hearts.

Mission and Ministry Children's Ministry Update - Becky Garrett reported a successful Valentine's Family Night and shared of the 7 children in the nursery, 4 will move up this year. VBS dates will be June 26-30 with a planning meeting in March to ask for volunteers.

After a presentation the Board voted to discontinue Lunch Bunch and Kid's Hope, as well as evaluate and revise the Children's Ministry Director Job description reflective of ending the above-mentioned ministries and adding VBS and Family Fun Night.

Pastor's Report After canceling January's Board Meeting due to illness both January and February's Pastor's Report were presented noting an attendance average of 125 and growing. Also included was a 2021 Statistical Report for overall breakdown of attendance, as well as giving.

Staff updates:

JoAnn: completing WOC Statistical Reports.

Norman: choir has resumed. Rear sanctuary projector not working.

Becky: see above mission and ministry report.

Joseph: mentioned roller skating at Piqua 36 and his communication to the congregation about his ministry transition.

Pastor Robbie: Lent Worship Series will be "Reframed", with corresponding Children's and Sunday school resources. New membership class is being planned. Annual Conference set as virtual on Jun 3-4.

Trustees The Stained Glass restoration is 90% funded. The Trustees made a \$ 20,000 payment to the Endowment Fund, which was borrowed from for the completion of the work. The South Tower is finished and the Board approved Trustees request to complete the North Tower and expect it to cost around the same. The Board approved the restoration of the North Tower for approximately \$13,000. The Boiler was State inspected and had some maintenance performed. Discussion on insurance (liability of hosting) will be continued...

Finance The finance report for December and January was reviewed and accepted. Weeks of Operations equal to 7.99 weeks. 2021 ended better than 2020. Endowment Fund Update- Total Donation, to date: \$231, 627. \$131,000 has been used in various projects. \$54,000 is the current gain as of 12/31/21.

Staff Parish Relations Welcome Chris Long and Wendy Black!

New Business Mary Jo received Board support to investigate LifeWise and Hoffman's potential involvement in this ministry.

Non-agenda Items Janet shared Young Spirits will have a final celebration at HUMC on Palm Sunday for alumni and current families instead of their traditional performances. This will likely conclude this ministry.

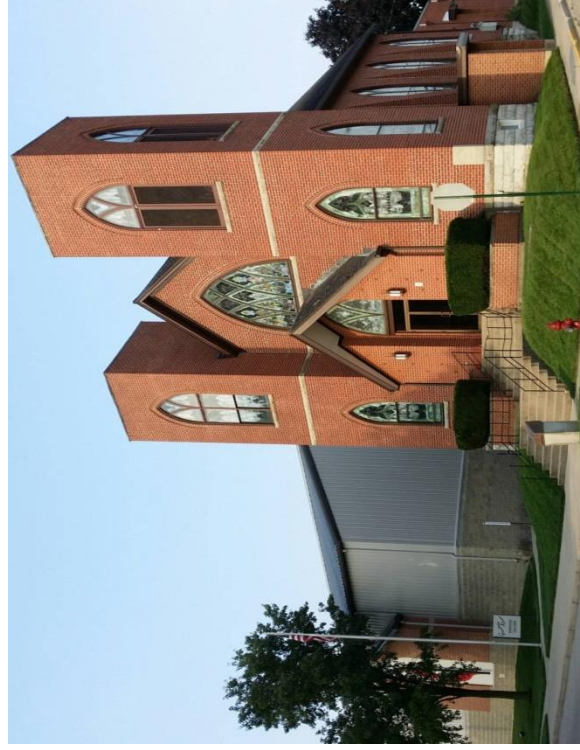
