A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Fanning Flames

2 Timothy 1:5-6 5 I have been reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also. 6 For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands..

I grew up with a fascination of fire. Maybe too much of a fascination. I knew I was of a certain "age" when I was permitted to hold my own candle for the Christmas Eve Service. I'm sure the pastor said something wonderful and insightful while I stood there mesmerized by the flickering flame. When older, I would volunteer to take the trash down over the hill of the property to the old rusty trash burning shopping cart, and I would watch with fascination as the various scraps of junk mail, milk cartons, and food scraps were subjected to and eventually consumed by the

flame. I will spare you most of the stories when I should have known better, and by the grace of God neither I or anyone else were harmed... I have stories of using fire to melt ice on church steps, or to burn away weeds, and at my parents home more recently, my brother and I were burning pile after pile of accumulated nonessential papers from our family home...and we ended up distracted by the marvelous consumption. That is what fire

does, it consumes..usually. From childhood I have loved that story in Exodus as an old man had his attention captured by flame, shrubbery burning before him, but not consumed. In the center of the page I used a picture from another article in 2019. I love the shape of the flame consuming a dried palm branch.

Several years ago I sat with a friend in front of a wood fireplace as we contemplated life. We did not speak for large segments of time, but occasionally one of us would take a poker and move a log here or there so the flame could have fresh fuel. The stirring of the flame reminded me of burning trash at my homeplace, that though the fire had its own life, I stoked the fire, and thus had a part in guiding, directing, and exciting the flames.

In recent years I have found fascinating the fact that often it is the vapor of fuel that burns, and not the fuel itself. When I chose with too little reflection to pour gasoline on some weeds around the rocks of a fire pit. I lit the weeds and watched with growing alarm as the flame darted around the fire pit, and then leapt through the air toward the gas can...still in my hand. I'm sure video footage would have been priceless as I was darting around in a "serpentine" manner, all while a flame was chasing me in the air (and I was picturing a scene from a diehard movie). Once I dropped the can in an upright position, I noted (from a distance) that the spout of the can had a flame lazily burning. It took a good while for me to decide to approach that plastic can and to, gulp, blow that flame out. The fuel was the gasoline, but it was the vapor that burned. I think of it as high speed evaporation of the liquid fuel. Our propane and natural gas furnaces and grills do similar things, they burn the vapor to produce heat. In processing that I recall the book of James refers to our lives as.....vapor...hmmm.

One of the greater privileges I have had through the years is to stoke the fire within other people. I get to fan the flames of God's

gift at work in someone's heart. And it is a privilege, but it is not mine alone. Every leader of a small group or class; every mentor or parent or grandparent; every friend or sibling or child has the opportunity to fan into flame the gift of God within someone else's heart (or to quench it). The gift is of God, not of humans. The spark, the beginning of the flame itself, just like Grace, Redemption, Communion and Baptism, comes from God. But in stoking

that flame, we can guide, direct, and even excite it in someone else. We can also pray, even pray to the Holy Spirit for that fire. We aren't used to doing that, but as a member of the Holy Trinity, this is within our grasp. Many of us in the Hoffman family have memories of a specific prayer to the Holy Spirit. As we journey through Advent together once more, and celebrate the Incarnation of the Christ, may we also invite the fire to be lit within us and within all those around by the Holy Spirit. Let us pray... Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in us the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and we shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. O, God, Who by thelight of the Holy Spirit did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that bythe same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy Your consolations. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Transfer of Securities

If you contribute appreciated securities that have been held more than 12 months directly to the charitable organization, no capital gains tax is due and, generally, a charitable deduction for the full fair market value may be realized. Please consult with your tax advisor should you have any questions.

Contribution of IRA

If you have an IRA and are over 70 ½ you may make a tax-free charitable donation directly from your IRA to a qualified charity (Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD). Please direct your IRA custodian to make a distribution directly to Hoffman United Methodist Church. Rules regarding IRA distributions and gifts are complicated. Please consult your tax advisor to determine if you qualify and for specific advice regarding your tax situation.

I wanted to thank all of you for your sausage orders since 1989 (our first year of selling sausage). Some of you may remember Jack Dexter who was our highest salesman, but somewhere in 1992 Les Trittschuh picked up the torch and was either the highest or second highest salesman in 31 of our 34 years of selling sausage. In those 34 years we've sold 11.6 TONS of sausage and had a net profit of \$28,929, which we have given to support local missions. In case you're wondering I think Les, with the support of Sharon, sold about 5.5 TONS of sausage. Thanks Les and Sharon and the other men who sold sausage over the years.

This might sound like an end of the Methodist Men's 34 years of sausage sales and that is because it is; we won't be selling sausage at the beginning of the 2023.
