A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Difficult Decisions Ahead

Acts 15:36-40 36 Some time later Paul said to Barnabas, "Let us go back and visit the brothers in all the towns where we preached the word of the Lord and see how they are doing." 37 Barnabas wanted to take John, also called Mark, with them, 38 but Paul did not think it wise to take him, because he had deserted them in Pamphylia and had not continued with them in the work. 39 They had such a sharp disagreement that they parted company. Barnabas took Mark and sailed for Cyprus, 40 but Paul chose Silas and left, commended by the brothers to the grace of the Lord.

We might be tempted to think of the days of Acts as happy times for Christianity, but that was not the case. There were persecutions, hard times, and many issues about which they disagreed. They wrestled with who was responsible for various ministries, they wrestled with what groups of people should be admitted into this particular spiritual movement, and they wrestled with who was worthy to be workers and leaders in that work. Does this sound similar to challenges we face in 2023? I think so. You may have a different sense of the disagreement in this passage and in our current United Methodist denomination, but I believe there were and are passionate feelings by dedicated workers in Christianity looking from varying points of view. Maybe Paul felt that John leaving them in Pamphylia meant he was not worthy of the work of the Lord. Barnabas may have felt this young person had a good reason for leaving but was deserving of an opportunity to serve. It is hard to know both sides clearly.

Within this newsletter you will find a survey. The special called General Conference session in 2019 passed provisions allowing congregations the opportunity to choose to leave the United Methodist denomination. It was temporary relaxation of "the trust clause." General Conference that year voted to temporarily allow congregations a graceful option of leaving with much of their assets and resources intact, but only for a season. Expiration dates were set at the end of 2023 with the expectation that the 2020 General Conference would likely amend the dates and/or the processes. The 2020 General Conference was delayed until 2021...and then 2022, and now to 2024 due to countries still struggling with severe health challenges in a worldwide denomination. With no General Conference, the 2023 deadline remained, and congregations across the country have been going through various processes to determine whether they want to consider leaving the denomination. If you have wondered why this is being discussed now, I hope this helps clarify.

As far as the question of "why leave the UMC?" There are a number of reasons that have been shared throughout the connection, but the main issues at play have to do with traditional Christian beliefs, especially around ordination and marriage and the LGBTQ+ community, who with the current language of the UMC law are prohibited to be married by UMC clergy or to be ordained. There are clergy, congregations and some regions of Methodism who have disagreed with the law, and have purposely disobeyed it, feeling it unjust to single out such persons. On the other side of it, those who agree with the current law are distressed and angered that our church law is being disregarded by those bound by it with no apparent consequences, which makes the law feel empty. While a little oversimplified, I feel this captures most of it. Legally, no congregation can "disaffiliate" from the UMC without an official in person vote by those who are members, and 66.67% in attendance at that vote would need to be agreed on leaving the denomination. Obviously this is potentially very divisive for our congregation, and I know many of us would prefer not to have a survey such as this going out. However, the leadership of this congregation needs to know how YOU feel about this. Within this Towers is a paper copy of the survey to reflect upon. At the beginning of the survey is a picture code that your smartphone camera, when pointed at it, will offer to take you to the link with a tap of your finger, and you can take the multiple choice survey and have your response recorded right then, confirmed by a message thanking you for taking it. Alternatively, a paper copy can be sent in or dropped off, but for the sake of those tallying, the digital method is faster and protects anonymity. While only full members of Hoffman could participate in an official vote, we want all who call Hoffman home, from teen on up, to please feel free to complete it.

The responses will allow the Church Board to have more clarity in our next steps. If you are able to complete the digital survey, do not send in or drop off the paper one. Each person should only complete the survey once. For those who want to fill out the paper survey and use it to fill out the digital one at the church, hold onto the paper survey and we will make devices available to you. Thank you in advance for taking part in this important work of discernment for our Hoffman Church Family.

The final survey will be edited and available for review ahead of the January board meeting to discuss the roll out of the survey.


