A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Pure Heart & Steadfast Spirit

Psalm 51:10-12 10 Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. 11 Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. 12 Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.

Recently our American Flag by Main Street needed to be taken down. The flag was severly damaged, nearly torn in two. This happens from time to time, but in this case the damage

was not from the normal wear and tear of the wind and weather. No, this time the source of damage was, of all things, new growth. Specifically, new growth from a memorial tree nearby. A single branch stretched upward and outward at just the right point that its new shoots entangled the flag, and in the midst of the winds, rains, and storms they pulled against each other, and the new growth won the tussle.

I think we are used to new growth being something to celebrate. Maybe

you too recently admired flowers blooming as a light layer of snow was covering the ground. We also have recently heard the sound of birds chirping, and we see and rejoice as bare branches start to show the signs of new buds. This challenge with the flag, however, reminded me that we don't always celebrate new growth. Along with the new growth of trees and flowers, there is also the growth of weeds. Along with the sound of young birds, or the sight of young woodland creatures are also the sights and sounds of insects, some of which seem to have no purpose but to be annoyances. There are other new seasons of growth that are also not welcome. My waistline and my forehead both seem to have new growth, and I feel more helpless to stop it the older I get. ^(C)

In very recent years we have also seen growth in depression, anxieties, suicides, and murders in the world around us. Inflation most recently has for many been a source of the growth of debt for many individuals and businesses. With all these things growing that we don't want to grow, there has also been a growth, unintended I believe, in the chasm



between human beings.

There are times when we can "get ahold of" ourselves, recognize that who we have settled into is not who we really want to be...but sometimes we can feel a little helpless about the feelings rumbling deep within us. This passage has something to say about that. Just as we can go into our gardens of vegetables, or flowers, and can take the garden down to the soil so the very best of the vegetation is able to

> grow and blossom; in the same way, God can create in us a pure heart, and God can renew a steadfast spirit within us, no matter what we have been through.

> To be fair, there are times of heartbreak that the renewing takes time, particularly in all the forms of grief we suffer in this life. That grief can revolve around the death of persons, but it also can include other deaths we experience. I find many times those who have had to endure a divorce also go through symptoms

often associated with grief. The death of relationships can certainly bring us to our lowest points emotionally, spiritually, and even physically. I for one am thankful I am not only left to my strength alone. And, I am not left alone to try to renew or restore myself. That would also feel helpless.

As far as the flag, once the tree branches had been pruned back to a healthier reach, a flag went up the pole, but not the same flag. No, a new flag was necessary this time. I recall a couple years ago we would hear many around us clamoring for things to get back to normal. However, we found ourselves instead finding new normals for our lives. Admittedly, not all of those were the "normal" we wanted, but it was heartwarming to hear there were some cases in which the new normal was better than the old. God may have something new for you, for me, and for Hoffman, as well. "Create in me a pure heart, O Lord, and renew a steadfast spirit within me."

Mission and Ministry

Joe Knostman reviewed results of the Congregation Survey. We have 200 household families that attend or call HUMC their home church. 156 emails were sent out to take the survey. We made 3 Sunday announcements about the survey. 108 responses were received. 75% of the surveys completed wanted to vote on disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. The board approved for informational meetings prior to a disaffiliation vote to allow church members to ask additional questions and be briefed on survey results. The board approved conducting a church member vote regarding disaffiliation in coordination with the assistance District Superintendent. The information session was set for 3/12/23 at 3pm







