A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

God Speaking to Our Sense Language

John 20:27-29 27 Then [Jesus] said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe." 28 Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!" 29 Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.".

Among the many things I have learned about myself in the last few years has been an increased awareness that certain sounds are bothersome. Unfortunately, there was a season in which the entire Scott household was compiling a list

of annoying sounds; a list of things that we did not want to hear, from mysterious high pitched sounds requiring a minor investigation to locate the source, to the somewhat rhythmic thumps of a neighbor playing on a drumset, to the sound of chewing, we found ourselves identifying a wide range of displeasing sounds. However, our senses are wonderful gifts, and if one isn't careful, that search to identify and eliminate the annoyances can accidentally override the discovery of so many wonderful things all around us. Our senses inform us so richly, and they permit us not only to enjoy, but to also "store" events in in our memory with the individual sense being somewhat the "password" for the event. When I am out riding the motorcycle, there are areas with smells that remind me I am riding through an area rich with irises, or honeysuckle, or crops, or even... livestock. I recall on mission trips to Vietnam we would often fly out of Ohio weather that was close to freezing temperatures. Even after multiple trips, when the doors of the airport opened in Hanoi or Saigon or DaNang, that the wave of heat of the night air would still surprise me. The smells of the city at night were the most unique I had ever experienced. I certainly couldn't say all the smells were "good," but the unique scents seemed to lock into my memory. I remember having some grilled shrimp at a restaurant in Dayton, and the seasoning included sriracha (yes, I did have to look up how to spell it), and as soon as I bit into it, I could remember being at a rooftop restaurant in a small village in Vietnam, and could in my mind "see" a young man

experiencing a rite of passage as he was going to "enjoy" consuming the beating heart of a viper. Yup, it was quite a day for us, haha! (you can be thankful I didn't include that picture) One of the psalmists reminds us in Psalm 34:8a to **Taste and see that the LORD is good.**

How wonderful that I am reminded of the goodness of God with every church carry in dinner I attend!

I wonder what should be said about the connection of our senses to faith? Our faith is certainly informed by our senses, but sometimes I am tempted to think of it as a sense. For some it seems to come so readily, and for others of us it is such a

challenge. I know we are used to the disciple Thomas being labeled a "doubter," but honestly, we too seek for proof before we believe.

You likely remember that the proof the Roman soldiers used to prove that Jesus had died on the cross was thrusting the spear into his side, and blood and water flowed. This proved his death, and his legs did not need to be broken. What was it Thomas wanted as proof to believe? To place his hand at the site and touch the wound that proved Jesus' death.

The passover meal that Jesus shared with his disciples was a multisensory meal they could see, touch, taste, and smell, all while hearing once more the story of God freeing His people. God has always been willing to speak to our senses.

How wonderful it is that Jesus was willing to speak to Thomas in the language he asked for....touch. We are becoming more aware of the various ways we communicate care and love for each other. Some time back we even talked about love languages, how each of us are affirmed and encouraged differently, some by touch, some by acts of service, some by gifts, words of affirmation, among others.

I am so glad that God is not lacking in any language necessary to speak to hearts today.

Hear, oh church! May we see, touch, smell and taste that the Lord is Good...but I would pass on the viper hearts. In His Service and Yours,

Board Meeting Highlights

Devotions

Devotions were offered by Patti from Rick Warren's Better Together 40 days of community. Meeting was opened with a prayer by Patti Wion.

Mission and Ministry

Joseph discussed the summary of the two informational meetings. There were 110 individuals with 100 having voting rights. He shared recommendations regarding next steps pending the disaffiliation vote.

Pastor's Report

February Average notes: overall average: 139.75 (+26 vs January). Logistics for the disaffiliation vote were discussed. Jill volunteered to check member's names at the door. Members must enter through the West Door only. There will be announcements at the Sunday services preceding the March 26, 2023 disaffiliation vote reminding the members of the vote, which door to enter, and that they should be here by 2:45 p.m. to make sure they are eligible to vote. Per the survey there was 85% agreement with the Book of Discipline. Pastor Robbie shared next steps if a disaffiliation vote is reached. There was one individual who attended the membership class. Pastor Robbie discussed the new West Ohio District Map. Hoffman is in the Western Lakes (Western) District. Miami County is at the southernmost point. Pastor Robbie met with Chief Wright at the Municipal building to talk about the possible creation of a Chaplain position. Honorarium of \$100 will be added to the Love Offering for Michael Wayne Smith.

Finance

The finance report for February was reviewed. Our year to date offering is \$5,000 higher than the same time last year. Weeks of Operations 11.10. If there is a vote for disaffiliation, the Board authorized two of the four authorized signers to close out the Endowment Fund and Credit Union Fund and deposit funds into the Designated Fund.

The trustees report was given. Wendy discussed the current projects including the schedule of stripping and waxing of church floors.

Nominations

No new business.

Staff Parish Relations

Met with District Superintendent Jim Wilson along with the board members on March 2, 2023. Staff Parish presented Hoffman's New Pastor Profile. Mr. Wilson answered questions regarding the vote agenda and steps the Board needed to complete.

Non-agenda items

Pending disaffiliation vote outcome, the board will have a ballot is available for voting to affiliate with the Global Methodist Church. A two thirds approval is needed. Wendy H. volunteered to help coordinate transportation for individuals for the vote.

Addendum

The board has met additionally to address issues regarding disaffiliation including: submitting a church profile to the Global Methodist Church to begin the pastor search, dealing with legal issues regarding changing our name, considering the outstanding Boy Scout settlement, etc.




Stained Glass Window Restoration Project
