Thank You for 8 years of Love and Support

Deuteronomy 34:1-5 Then Moses climbed Mount Nebo from the plains of Moab to the top of Pisgah, across from Jericho. There the LORD showed him the whole land-- .... Then the LORD said to him, "This is the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob when I said, 'I will give it to your descendants.' I have let you see it with your eyes, but you will not cross over into it." And Moses the servant of the LORD died there in Moab, as the LORD had said.

We are entering a season I do not enjoy. I have known for some time that I was experiencing some last events with this congregation, but I tend to push the feelings back and away so that everything can get done. But as box stacks grow in the parsonage, and empty boxes await filling in my office, I am forced to note the calendar's reminder of the moving trucks' scheduled departure in June. Maybe it is a little too dramatic to use Moses' death as segue though, haha!

I find myself reminded of countless memories shared here in this community and congregation. Other than my home church, I have never been with one congregation for so long. My son arrived in West Milton a first grader, and will be a

sophomore in high school this fall, so I guess I know my gray hairs didn't come from nowhere. One of the reasons I have embraced itineracy, the occasional change of pastors, was not for a theological reason. I believe there is only so much of "me" a church should have to endure. 🖅



Hoffman has been more than gracious with my various "unique" ways of doing and seeing things while serving as your pastor. I want to thank you for allowing that space to be relatively "myself," for I am fully aware that is not possible everywhere. I am pleased we survived that together, and it is possible we did better than survive. We have managed to find ways to laugh together several times over these years, though there have been seasons the chuckles are accompanied by tears. One of my least favorite experiences is to know some people well enough that they are practically extended family, and then to share in the remembrances of their lives. I know, it is what people in my position do, and it is an honor, but even as we celebrate the heavenly home they are stepping into, I, like you, grieve the conversations I won't have with them on this side of eternity. Moving feels a little like that, as ministry doesn't tend to allow an abundane of spare time, so trips back to previous churches do not happen very often at all, and to imagine some people not being in my life feels a bit like grief.

There are some of you I even have had the privilege of arguing with...you see, I have to really think highly of someone to risk making them angry, so if you are among that number, please know that you were among those I trust carrying the mission forward. That mission of course is not mine, but is Hoffman's that I adopted and tried my best to live into, a mission to fulfill the Lord's Great Commission in this community and world.

This account of Moses is of one who knows his time is coming to an end, and the Lord is kind enough to let him have a glimpse of where the people are going, and who is going to be leading them there. It was a gift to Moses, and it has been

> a gift afforded to me, as well. While my time on earth and in ministry is not done, my time here nearly is. I leave here thankful for a school system full of caring educators, thankful for a small town to know many neighbors and town leaders by name, and thankful that the paths of the people of this congregation and of my family have crossed for this season. How has it been 8 years already? Thank you

for the multiple ways you have encouraged, prayed for, and served alongside my family and me. There won't be words to express how much that has meant.

If there is nothing else you remember from our time together, remember this. "A text without a context is a pretext for a prooftext." I'm sure there is someone wanting to see that in writing.


