A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Thessalonians 5:23)


I have recently returned from the convening

annual conference of the Allegheny West Conference of the Global Methodist Church. It was an exciting time of fellowship, worship, teaching, and vision casting. As we prayed, sang and gathered, looking forward in the hopes of a blessed future, we also looked back. One of the hallmarks of the Global Methodist movement is an attempt to retrieve some of the distinctive elements and gifts of the original Methodist movement, as well as the larger Church across time and space.

The leader of the first Methodists, John Wesley, described the mission of Methodism as: 'To reform the nation, and in particular the Church, to spread scriptural holiness over the land." Along the

lines of holiness, Wesley and the Methodist taught a notion of Christian perfection or perfect love. They taught that this "is love excluding sin, love filling the heart, taking up the whole capacity of the soul." In other words, the Methodists believed that God really could, as the Scripture above says, "sanctify you through and through" and make you a holy person. God really can sanctify a person to such an extent that the only motivation within that person's heart is love of God and neighbor – perfect love.

Some, or many, may find this belief too optimistic, too far-fetched. It doesn't take sin seriously enough and those Methodists must have been mistaken, thinking we humans are better than we *really* are. However, Methodists, like the many centuries of Christians before them, do take sin seriously and do understand that the brokenness and fallenness of humanity.



The optimism of perfect love comes not from what we humans are capable of, but what God is capable of. Being entirely sanctified in this way, with love filling the heart, and crowding out sin, is what God desires and wants for each of us. After all, we recognize that God's will for us is to "be conformed to the image of his Son" (Romans 8:29).

This is more than simply a peripheral, minor belief

related to Methodism. Wesley says in a letter, "This doctrine is the grand depositum which God has lodged with the people called Methodists; and for the sake of propagating this chiefly He appeared to have raised us up." In other words, *the* purpose of God raising up this movement was to spread the message of Christian perfection – that ordinary people like you and me could be so sanctified and filled with the love of God that we would be true imitators of Christ.

Holiness is one of the distinguishing marks of Methodist Christianity and is one of the attractive elements it proclaims: God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit invite us into the life

of God, to receive salvation and forgiveness of sins, *and* to be transformed into someone whose thoughts, words, and actions reflect the love of Jesus Christ for all of humanity and creation. This message of complete life change was and *is* truly good news. Ordinary men and women, like you and me, who know our sin and brokenness, can "walk in the light as He is in the light" (1 John 1:7).

As mentioned earlier, some may believe this is naïve optimism. I would ask, however, what is the worst thing that could happen, if you made this your prayer: "God, so fill me with the grace of your Holy Spirit that my only motivation is love of You and my neighbors. God, help me to truly love you with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength; and my neighbor as myself"? What if you prayed this prayer daily, and even believed God honored such a prayer? Let's try it and find out.

This letter and the attached card are sent to you as an invitation to prayerfully consider the ways God is leading you to support the mission of Jesus Christ at Hoffman Global Methodist Church in 2024.

God, in His infinite goodness and mercy, allows people like us to join Him in a saving relationship, and to join His work in redeeming and reconciling creation to Himself. As we join as His body, the Church, in the West Milton community, we have a variety of ways we can participate in that mission. The pledge card at the bottom of this brief letter is designed to help you pray and consider how you can take part in the ministries of Hoffman Global Methodist Church.

The <u>General Fund</u> ("Budget Need") is our default operations budget. It includes utilities, supplies, and staff salaries for the year. We are praying in 2024 for God to lead us to some new avenues for ministry, to reach out to our community with the saving love of Jesus Christ. Part of that prayer, then, is also for the necessary resources to carry out such ministries. If **no** designation is marked, gifts and offerings are placed in the General Fund.

<u>Missions</u> are finances specifically designated to help others. Our church already has a significant impact locally, in the community and in the local schools. We are also looking for ways to be part of what God is doing in other parts of the world, both nationally and internationally. Any funds designated for **Missions** contribute to these areas of ministry.

Our Trustees manage the <u>Maintenance</u> and <u>Capital Improvements</u> line items, which focus specifically on the care of Hoffman facilities. One of the realities of church ministry is that our facilities are an integral part of how we worship and serve God and His people. We have been blessed with a tremendous facility and even better people who take care of it, maintain it, and improve it when needed. On the board in the sanctuary, "Building Fund" records <u>both</u> the Maintenance and Capital Improvement giving from the previous week. While <u>Maintenance</u> is for the general upkeep of our facilities, <u>Capital Improvements</u> refers to larger projects that the church will take on to improve and update the facilities.

On behalf of the church board and the finance committee, I want to thank each one of you who is contributing to the work of Christ through the ministries of our church. Our Time, our Talents, and our Treasure are three wonderful ways God invites us to join what He's doing in the world and in the lives of people. We invite you to pray, talk to God, reflect, and dream about how you can serve the community and world through the ministries of Hoffman GMC.

Please know that these cards are between you and God. Only the financial secretary will look at them, so we can gather estimated figures and plan for the upcoming year of ministry. You are not bound by anything written on this card. Let the Holy Spirit guide you as you envision what involvement in the church looks like this coming year.

Please put your pledge card in the box provided at the front of the church by November 12, which will be **Pledge Sunday**. That Sunday we will have a time of prayer and blessing for your pledges and the work of the church.

Advent Study, Future-Seekers Class

The Future-Seekers class will begin a 6-week Advent study on December 3 using the book, Freedom is Coming: From Advent to Epiphany with the Prophet Isaiah by Nick Baines. This book presents familiar passages from Isaiah that we often use during the Christmas season and asks us to think about them from two perspectives. Rev. Baines explains the situation of the Israelites in Isaiah's time who were living as exiles in Babylon. They were discouraged as they tried to understand why God had let this happen and were desperate for hope as they waited for God's promises to be fulfilled. How did they interpret the same words we hear, and the same words we use to celebrate Christ's birth, when they didn't know Christ? How did they manage to remain faithful to God during the 70 years of their exile? The author then asks us to learn from Isaiah and the Israelites how to hold on to our own faith and hope for the future within the challenges of 21st century life. Materials will be provided. If you have not yet attended an adult Sunday School class, this 6-week commitment (no class Dec. 24) might be a good place to start. The material will be familiar but the perspective will be new, and you will learn a lot about Isaiah and the history of the Israelites.
