A Word from our Pastor

You have given me the shield of your salvation, and your right hand has supported me, and your gentleness made me great. (Psalm 18:35) Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Last month I was at a gathering with some friends who serve in various churches and ministries. Part of our time was spent confessing before the group, twelve people, and having the rest of the group surround and

pray for the person who had just shared. After sharing myself, a friend of mine shared that the word "gentle" had come to mind. Continuing, he said, "The Lord is gentle towards you. He also wants you to be gentle with vourself."

Just a few weeks after this prayer time I stumbled across this phrase from Psalm 18: "your gentleness made me great." It stopped me in my tracks and took me right back to the words my friend had shared before faithful brothers and sisters prayed for me.

How does God's gentleness make us great?

For one, it takes the pressure off. The concept of gentleness draws is to this invitation from Jesus: "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30)

To receive God's gentleness toward us in Christ is to not give into the lie that it is all up to us. Rather, we are told if we come to Him, He will give us rest and that as we take upon us His yoke, we will learn from Him. He will teach us. He will show us. And it's a yoke that is easy, a burden that is light. The pressure it has it all figured out,

to make our own way, and be self-sufficient is stripped away by the gentleness of God.


Additionally, God's gentleness toward us gives us permission to ease up on ourselves. So many of us have a ruthless inner critic. Even while extending mercy and

> understanding to others, we are harsh and unforgiving with ourselves. Yet, the Lord is gentle toward us. Of course, God's gentleness does not mean turning a blind eye toward sin and the things in our hearts that need His healing work. However, there is a difference between conviction (meant to lead us to repentance) and condemnation (which leads to shame and a defeated life). God's gentleness releases us from the need to punish ourselves, as if we could actually pay for our

mistakes. That idea, of course, fails to consider and graciously receive the atoning work of the cross of Christ.

Finally, as we are gentle with ourselves, perhaps we seek to extend the gentleness of God to others. By the power of God's holy love working in us, we find ourselves exhibiting patience, kindness, and mercy toward others. How great it would be if people found is Christians as people who were filled with gentleness, patience, and kindness. And it would be even better if encounters with God's people led persons into the kindness of God for themselves. Let us pray that it will be so.




