A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

"put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness. (Ephesians 4:22-24)

As we have crossed the 6-month mark of our transition together, the church board and I took a look at our mission statement and "mission principles." The statement and principles are a guide for helping us remember WHY - why do we, Hoffman Global Methodist Church, exist? We have done some reflecting and intentional retrieval of the best of our Methodist roots. It is not that we think that Methodism is the only true expression of Christianity, but we think it is a good one.

The original mission statement of the Methodist movement was: "to reform the nation, especially the church, and spread scriptural holiness over the land." If you were to ask someone what Methodism was about, why it existed as a part of the body of Christ, the answer you would likely get is "holiness" - to see believers and communities become like Christ in their hearts and lives, and to impact the world around them for the spread of that holiness.

I do not know about you, but I immediately recognize the need for this in my own life, and for a body of believers to hold onto this as its call. I need to be made holy, made more like Christ in the affections and desires of my heart, as well as in my thoughts, words, and actions. And the world needs churches that are more than spiritual pep rallies with religious-flavored entertainment. The world needs churches that take seriously "the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:14), being transformed by the grace of the Holy Spirit, one person, one family, and one community at a time.

Our current mission statement, then, is: Hoffman Global Methodist Church exists to join God's mission of making disciples who demonstrate holiness of heart and life. Notice our mission is not solely ours but is about joining the work that belongs to God, which He graciously invites us into.

What does holiness of heart and life look like? This is a question with a lot of different answers, but one helpful guidepost comes from this prophetic statement from Methodism's original leader, John Wesley: "I am not afraid that the people called Methodists should ever cease to exist either in Europe or America. But I am afraid lest they should only exist as a dead sect, having the form of religion without the power. And this undoubtedly will be the case unless they hold fast both the doctrine, spirit, and discipline with which they first set out." Wesley was convinced that unless Methodists held fast to the way of life that originally made it such a dynamic move of the Holy Spirit, they would become a lifeless organism - one that displayed the outward appearance of a church but was spiritually empty inside.

It can be helpful then, to look at these categories as key marks for holiness of heart and life:

Doctrine: hearts and lives that demonstrate knowledge of and adherence to the historic Christian faith of the Scriptures and the Creeds.

Spirit: hearts and lives that are becoming increasingly more obedient to God's will, led by the Holy Spirit, exhibiting Christlike character and the fruit of the Spirit.

Discipline: hearts and lives that are ordered around spiritual disciplines that help us grow in the grace of God, such as: weekly worship, daily devotion - reading Scripture and prayer, accountable discipleship bands, service.

Let us pray that God would have His way in us and in our church. Let us pray that as we make ourselves available to His grace that He would shape us and sanctify us into those whose hearts and lives are holy. Let us pray that the work God does in us communicates the great hope of His love for the world.

New Adult Sunday School Bible Study: 1 Peter

The Future-Seekers adult Sunday school class (downstairs in the open room) will be starting a new Bible study on February 3. We will study the book of 1 Peter, written by one of the most candid and outspoken of the twelve disciples: the one who was brave enough to try to walk across the water to Jesus, the one who denied knowing Jesus—three times—after saying he would never deny him, the one to whom Jesus gave the name Peter, which means 'the Rock' and re-established their relationship after the Resurrection by asking—three times—the question, 'Do you love me?' It was Peter who was preaching at Pentecost when 3000 were baptized. He was with Jesus during the three years of Jesus' ministry, asked questions no one else would ask, was 'impulsive, rash and inconsistent,' and made mistakes he regretted. According to David Pawson, 'Many believers identify with Peter, because he is so like them.'

How did Peter's time with Jesus affect his own ministry? How different is his viewpoint from Paul's? As he worked to establish the early church, was he still brash and bold and error-prone? What was his message to the churches that were under Roman persecution? These are some of the questions we hope to answer as we study the book, **Be Hopeful**, by Warren Wiersbe.
