A Word from our Pastor



And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb. (Luke 2:21)

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Happy New Year! As we cross the threshold from 2023 to 2024 on January 1, we are currently in the midst of the twelve day season of celebrating Christ's birth, which ends January 6. In addition to having its significance as a secular date, January 1 has spiritual significance in connection to the church calendar.

If we are counting from Christmas - the celebration of the birth of Christ - then January 1 is the eighth day. We read in Luke 2:21, "And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb." This day is referred to as "The Holy Name of Jesus" or "The Circumcision of Christ." Take a moment to consider the Son of God, the second Person of the Trinity humbling Himself in such a way.

We first encounter circumcision in the Bible in Genesis 17, as God commands Abraham that "every male among you shall be circumcised." Circumcision functions as the covenant marker for males in the Old Covenant, to be performed on the eighth day. Through Christ and his obedience to the Law, the sign of circumcision is fulfilled and given a whole new significance. The Apostle Paul connects the marker of circumcision with baptism, the New Covenant marker for those (male and female) in Christ. "In him also you were circumcised with a circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ, having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through

faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead" (Colossians 2:11-12).

The physical act of removing a part of the body points us to the spiritual act of the removal of our sinful flesh, granted to us by the grace of God. Paul adds in Romans 2 that "circumcision is a matter of the heart, by the Spirit, not by the letter" (v. 29). This circumcision of the heart is signified in baptism - ritual participation in the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. While baptism is a one-time event in which we are initiated into Christ's Body, the Church, and incorporated into God's acts of saving mercy, it takes a lifetime to walk in or live out our baptism.

Day by day, moment by moment, is how we live out the "circumcision of the heart." Through the grace bestowed on us in baptism and every day after that, we seek to cut away the parts of our lives that are incompatible with a life of discipleship. We avail ourselves of this grace by continually communing with God through the means He makes Himself available to us: worship, prayer, Scripture, accountable discipleship, fasting, acts of mercy.

Almighty God, who made Your blessed Son to be circumcised and obedient to the law for man: Grant us the true circumcision of the Spirit, that, our hearts and all our members being mortified from all worldly and carnal lusts, we may in all things obey Your blessed will, through the same Your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*¹



The Jordan River Rules

Several years ago our class studied The <u>Red Sea Rules</u> by Robert J. Morgan. It is one of our favorite books and he remains one of our favorite authors. This book told the story of the Israelites at the Red Sea and used their story to illustrate ten 'rules' we can use for dealing with our own serious difficulties. The Lord parted the waters for the Israelites and kept them safe, and He can do the same for us as we face life's toughest challenges.

But do you know God parted the waters for His people a second time?

Forty years after the Red Sea experience, God divided the waters of the Jordan River and led His people into the Promised Land. You would think, after all those years in the desert, that they would have welcomed the change, but it was not an easy adjustment. Robert Morgan has written another book, <u>The Jordan River Rules: 10 God-Given Rules for Moving Forward</u>, to show us how to get past the drastic changes that sometimes occur in our lives. Some of these changes are ones we have chosen, but some of them are changes that life and its circumstances have chosen for us.

Whatever situation you find yourself in, God intends for you to go forward. All your difficulties, disruptions, and adversities are simply God's preparation for stronger days ahead. God wanted the Israelites to move toward the new life He had promised them by taking one step at a time, trusting that He would get them past their struggles in the desert and where He wanted them to be. God will do the same for us.
