A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

"Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble." (Matthew 6:34)

One of the greatest challenges to the Christian life is being faithful with what's right in front of us.

To be faithful with what is in front of us is to ask, "What has God given me to tend to today?" This is difficult because what we are given this day is often not what we prefer or what we would like to tend to. We would rather tend to something else. Or we would rather fantasize about the future in which we can imagine tending to the things we would enjoy tending to.

One of the dangers about focusing on the future too much is that it pulls us away from *this day*, the day the Lord has made, the day God has given us to rejoice in Him, follow Him, and be faithful to His commands. Focusing on the future disables us from being present to reality, to life as it is. But if we want to encounter God, to grow in His grace, and receive His blessing, we must encounter Him in reality, our life as it is - not as we wish it would be. The well-known Serenity Prayer is helpful in expressing how to navigate this challenge.

As we seek obedience to God *today* in all things, we are learning to deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Jesus. As we walk with Jesus step-by-step *today*, we are learning how to say, "Not my will, but Yours be done." We are learning how to crucify the sinful desires of the flesh, that Christ's resurrected life may transform more and more of ourselves. A 6th-7th century monk named John Climacus said, "Obedience is the tomb of the will, and the resurrection of humility."

Another challenge to this day-by-day obedience is that it is not flashy. This is especially challenging

in our social media age, where everyone is tempted to be an "influencer," to be someone important who does really big things for God. However, most often what the Lord calls us to do seems so ordinary. Wouldn't it be easier to build up faith and obedience for the exciting, adventurous tasks? Perhaps those opportunities will come, but again, we ask, "What are you calling me to do *this* day, Lord?" And usually, it is something we would rather not do: like showing grace to that irritating person at work, or asking that friend how we can pray for him or her when we're nervous that it will make things a little awkward, or being more patient and present with the people under our roof.

I invite you to pray the following prayer each morning for the next week, as we all seek to be faithful to God *this day*.

Prayer for the Beginning of the Day

O Lord, grant me to greet the coming of the day in peace, help me in all things to rely upon Your holy will. In every hour of the day reveal Your will to me. Bless my dealings with all who surround me. Teach me to treat all that comes to me throughout the day with peace of soul and with firm conviction that Your will governs all. In all my deeds and words, guide my thoughts and feelings. In unforeseen events, let me not forget that all are sent by You. Teach me to act firmly and wisely, without embittering or embarrassing others. Give me strength to bear the fatigue of the coming day with all that it shall bring. Direct my will, teach me to pray. And, Yourself, pray in me. Amen.

Bulldog Bags

Mission: To provide food for students who need nourishment throughout the weekend.

Reason: We know that some student's nutritious meals only come from being at school. We want to help supplement items so that children are not hungry when they arrive at school each Monday.

Goal: To be able to find the funds and volunteers to include all students K-5th grade who need food for the weekends. This amounts to about \$46,000.00.

How it works: Once a week, on Thursday, a group of volunteers get together at the school, with the help of high school students, we package bags of food. It takes about two hours and then the food gets passed out on Fridays to go home with the students who have been approved to take home a Bulldog Bag. The bags typically include 12 items, such as cereal, Nutri-Grain bars, crackers, applesauce, fruit cup, snack items, etc.

How you can help: We are asking all congregations, groups and individuals to consider a commitment to sponsoring students for next year. You can sponsor one or more children, per month or per year.
