



A Word from our Pastor

Brothers and sisters in Christ, I like to read. I often find myself recommending what I am reading to different friends, based on what it is I am reading and the friends that come to mind while I am reading it. Lately, there has been one book I have kept recommending to just

about everyone I know. I now recommend it to you as well. The book is *On the Edge of Hope* by Mark Chironna. I could not stop highlighting passages in the book, and often found myself setting the book down after a particularly powerful sentence to let the weight of the words sink in. And then would snap a picture of the cover of the book and send it to a friend, saying something like, "Get this book and read it right now!"

The book is the telling of Chironna's three-year battle with darkness, crippling fear, anxiety, and depression; and how he came to a

place of healing in Christ. One of the most powerful things about the book is the utter honesty with which he details his own struggle. In his telling of his journey, you will not find cliches or slogans or out-of-context Bible verses that attempt to mask real pain and suffering. It is raw and it is real. Several nights after reading a chapter or two I would tell Holly it felt like I had gone through a counseling session. It really hit that deeply.

While I have recommended *On the Edge of Hope* to just about everyone I know, men and women alike, I find it especially helpful that a man has written this book. A lot of men have not had healthy, Christian models for learning how to deal

with and process disappointment, stress, failure, hurt, bitterness, etc. Here we have a book written by a man whose faith in Christ is the most important thing, yet also walked through suffering and pain, and gives us an honest glimpse into his experience. I feel strongly about recommending this to men in my life who are hurting and

struggling while being faithful to Jesus, because it lets them know: "You are not alone. Your struggle does not mean you are doing something wrong. There is hope and healing, and it doesn't come from avoiding your pain or pretending it isn't there."

I will leave you with one passage near the end of the book that describes what Chironna experienced the Lord doing through his journey: **"I had to face something unfamiliar, something unexpected in the one place I thought I knew so** well. Why? Because our fears often present themselves to us to teach us

how little we understand about what we think we know best. The closer we get to the truth, the more we resist it... Life, real life, requires growth. And we can have no growth without crossing thresholds. That crossing always requires us to step through anxiety... The Lord was taking me into my deepest basement, the darkest, dingiest places in my own history. He did not do this to destroy me but to free and to heal me."

May we all trust the Lord enough for Him to do this deep-level work in our souls, not to destroy us, but to free and heal us.

This letter and the attached card are sent to you as an invitation to prayerfully consider the ways God is leading you to support the mission of Jesus Christ at Hoffman Global Methodist Church in 2025.

The pledge card at the bottom of this brief letter is designed to help you pray and consider how you can take part in the ministries of Hoffman Global Methodist Church to spread the Gospel in the community of West Milton and beyond. In church finances we often talk about the tithe -10%. I want to encourage you to not feel the pressure to jump to 10% right away, but to consider what a "step up" looks like. Maybe that is more like going from 3% to 4%. The Lord blesses our steps of obedience and receives giving from a grateful heart.

The <u>General Fund</u> ("Budget Need") is our default operations budget. It includes utilities, supplies, and staff salaries for the year. Your continued, faithful giving makes the ongoing and new ministries of the church possible. If **no** designation is marked on an offering, those gifts and donations are by default placed in the General Fund, our primary budget for the ministries of our church.

<u>Missions</u> are finances specifically designated to help other ministries and groups outside of our local church. So far in 2024, we have been able to bless a variety of ministries, locally and globally, with over \$5000. This is made possible by funds designated for **Missions**.

Our Trustees manage the <u>Maintenance</u> and <u>Capital Improvements</u> line items, which focus specifically on the care of Hoffman facilities. Our facilities are an integral part of how we worship and serve God and His people. We have been blessed with a tremendous facility and *even better* people who take care of it, maintain it, and improve it when needed. On the board in the sanctuary, "Building Fund" records <u>both</u> the Maintenance and Capital Improvement giving from the previous week. While <u>Maintenance</u> is for the general upkeep of our facilities, <u>Capital Improvements</u> refers to larger projects that the church will take on to improve and update the facilities.

On behalf of the church board, I want to thank each one of you who is contributing to the work of Christ through the ministries of our church. Our Time, our Talents, and our Treasure are three wonderful ways God invites us to join what He's doing in the world and in the lives of people. We invite you to pray, talk to and listen to God, reflect, and dream about how you can serve the community and world through the ministries of Hoffman GMC.

Please know that these cards are between you and God. *Only the financial secretary will look at them, only so we can gather estimated figures and plan for the upcoming year of ministry.* You are not bound by anything written on this card. Let the Holy Spirit guide you as you envision what involvement in the church looks like this coming year.

*Please put your pledge card in the box provided at the front of the church by November 10, which will be Pledge Sunday. That Sunday we will have a time of prayer and blessing for your pledges and the work of the church.*

#### Support Your Church Through Your IRA Required Minimum Distribution

Are you over the age of, or approaching 70-1/2 and must take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) annually from your traditional IRA? This Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) is taxed as ordinary income.

Why not consider turning some or all of your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) into a <u>Qualified</u> <u>Charitable Distribution (QCD)</u> to your Church to fulfill all or part of your annual contribution, and/or for a special project? In so doing, the amount donated is excluded from your taxable income keeping your taxable income lower.

Qualified Charitable Distributions don't require you to itemize. Therefore, you may choose to take advantage of the higher standard deduction and still use a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) for charitable giving.

#### To make a Qualified Charitable Distribution, certain requirements must be met:

• You must be  $70\frac{1}{2}$  or older

• The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a <u>Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)</u> is \$100,000. Your spouse may also be able to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from his or her own IRA in the same tax year for up to \$100,000.

Your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) can be made to one or more charities, such as the church, or IHN, or any qualified charity. You may also stipulate how you wish your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) be used by the organization you are supporting such as the Food Pantry or the Youth Program.
For a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to count toward your current year's Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), the funds must come out of your IRA by your Required Minimum Distribution deadline, generally December 31. However, it is wise to not wait to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) until the deadline date since the IRA Custodian needs time to process your request.

#### Tax reporting

A <u>Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)</u> is reported as a normal distribution on IRS Form 1099-R for any non-inherited IRAs. While the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) amount is not taxed, you may not then claim the distribution as a charitable tax deduction.

To accompany your tax form, you will need a letter from the charity detailing that the gift came directly from your IRA custodian and that you received no goods or services in exchange for your gift.

#### Next steps?

Consult your tax or legal advisor. Then notify your IRA custodian you wish to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). <u>The Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) must be sent directly to the charity</u> by the IRA Custodian. If it is sent to you, it will be considered taxable income.

Transfer of Securities

If you contribute appreciated securities that have been held more than 12 months directly to the charitable organization, no capital gains tax is due and, generally, a charitable deduction for the full fair market value may be realized. Please consult with your tax advisor should you have any questions.
