## A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

#### Mark 2:17

Jesus said to them, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."

God is love. The greatest commandments, according to Jesus, are to love God with all our hearts, all our souls, all our minds, and all our strengths; and to love our neighbors as ourselves. Christianity is a religion of love. The Scriptures are meant to lead us to the knowledge and practice of love. St. Augustine wrote, "Whoever, therefore, thinks that he understands the divine Scriptures or any part of them so that it does not build the double love of God and of our neighbor does not understand it at all."

God is love. God expresses and demonstrates for us what love is. Sometimes we make the mistake of taking our half-correct (and, therefore, half-wrong) conceptions of love and pasting them onto God, determining God must act in accordance with these ideas. As Christians, we let the Lord and Giver of life determine what love is and what love requires.

So how has God demonstrated His love for you? He has pursued us, been patient with us, continued to have mercy on us. Consider all that we have put our heavenly Father through as His rebellious children. Then consider how great His love is for us, still. While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. He has wiped our slate clean. Love looks like the Cross – sacrificial, selfless offering for the sake of others, especially others who do not deserve it.

God's love for me is an example of God's heart for broken people. You and I are broken. It is foolish to pretend otherwise, to consider ourselves whole, while we think of others as broken. No, we all need Jesus. God loves the broken. It is the broken He came to save. Let us continue to bring our brokenness to Him. We see in the Gospels, and we know in experience, Jesus goes where the wounds are. He responds to our brokenness, not our strength.

We all need the love of God. Early on the Church took on the image of being a "hospital for sinners." We are part of the Church, and we go to church, not because we are healthy and have come to receive our trophies and badges for a job well-done. We are part of the Church, and we go to church, because we need the healing mercy of Christ.

This love we receive is the love we share through the power of the Holy Spirit. The love we share in witnessing to others does not have to be in the context of Bible trivia and having all of people's questions answered. Sharing our faith can be as simple as sharing how your life has been changed by the love of God. The late Brennan Manning said, "Evangelism is just one beggar telling another where to find bread."

Let us pray to keep our eyes on the One who is love, who has loved us, who continues to love us, no matter what. Let us pray that we will have, in the words of John Wesley: "love governing the heart and life, running through all our tempers, words and actions."


