A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. (Ephesians 3:17b-19)

Brothers and sisters, How great is the love of God!

One aspect of God's love that sets Him apart is that His love never runs out. In Jeremiah 31:3 we read, "The LORD appeared to us in the past, saying: 'I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness.'" Everlasting. Unfailing. We may sometimes think that we have overdrawn our account of grace or that we have bumped into the limit of God's love with our sins and asking for forgiveness. Yet, keep in mind Jesus tells the disciples to forgive without counting (see Matthew 18:21-22). If people like us are expected to extend forgiveness every time someone repents (see Luke 17:3-4), how much more will God extend His mercy toward us when we repent and ask for forgiveness during our lives!

God's love also does what is needed. It is more than strong feelings toward us but is demonstrated in *actions* toward us. God creates us, sustains us with His grace, "makes his sun shine on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matthew 5:45). Nowhere is God's love more evident than the cross of Jesus Christ. Our salvation, our place in God's family as His sons and daughters, hinges on the cross. In his book *The Meaning of Marriage*, the late Tim Keller says, "We are so evil and sinful and flawed that Jesus had to die for us.

We were so lost that nothing less than the death of the divine Son of God could save us. But we are so loved and valued that he was willing to die for us. The Lord of the universe loved us enough to do that!" St. John Chrysostom says it this way: "By the cross we know the gravity of sin and the greatness of God's love toward us."

God's love never runs out. His mercies are new every day. God's love takes action through the cross of Jesus to redeem us. And God's love makes us whole. It sanctifies and heals us. This aspect of God's grace focuses on what happens to us after we have put their faith in Jesus, becoming God's sons and daughters. In the family of God and having been born again, the Holy Spirit works in our lives to make us holy, more like Jesus. This process we call sanctification. This is often expressed through the fruit of the Spirit, listed in Galatians 5. As the process of sanctification continues and we grow in God's grace, these characteristics develop and mature in us: "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23). What God is doing through sanctification is a deep, healing work in our souls. Through sin, through trauma, and through the messiness of the world, we have become very sick. We have developed sinful habits, addictions, and unhealthy ways of coping to get along in this life. God's wants to heal those areas of soul sickness and set us free from the bondage of the fear of death. He wants us to experience the freedom that He died and rose to give us. How great is the love of God!

Bulldog Bags

Mission: To provide food for students who need nourishment throughout the weekend.

Reason: We know that some student's nutritious meals only come from being at school. We want to help supplement items so that children are not hungry when they arrive at school each Monday.

Goal: To be able to find the funds and volunteers to include all students K-5th grade who need food for the weekends. This amounts to about \$46,000.00.

How it works: Once a week, on Thursday, a group of volunteers get together at the school, with the help of high school students, we package bags of food. It takes about two hours and then the food gets passed out on Fridays to go home with the students who have been approved to take home a Bulldog Bag. The bags typically include 12 items, such as cereal, Nutri-Grain bars, crackers, applesauce, fruit cup, snack items, etc.

How you can help: We are asking all congregations, groups and individuals to consider a commitment to sponsoring students for next year. You can sponsor one or more children, per month or per year.
