A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid. (John 14:27) "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33)

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

We all want peace. The peace we so desperately long for comes from God, though we will search for it just about everywhere else. Sometimes we try to achieve peace by comparing ourselves with other people, thinking we will feel better about ourselves if there is someone in a lower position than us in some aspect of life. Comparison will never give us peace, because it only makes us more competitive. Comparison leads to competition, which leads to rivalry, which leads to hatred.

Peace comes from resting in our baptismal identity. We are sons, daughters of the Heavenly Father, with whom God is well-pleased, washed clean and forgiven, born of the water and Holy Spirit, buried and raised with Christ. When this becomes the first word about us, and the place we begin from, we are established in peace. Every thought, word, and action can then spring from this place of accepting we are accepted in God through Christ. Think about how much less scrapping, clawing, and striving we would each do if we were to begin with our baptismal identity, if we were to "Remember your baptism and be thankful."

The above verses tell us that Jesus gives His followers His peace. He desires for us to be at peace. Jesus is aware that "in this world we will have trouble," yet even in a troubling world He gives us His peace in order that our hearts will not be troubled and afraid. Often, we believe that peace is the absence of something – the absence of conflict or trouble or hardship or suffering. Yet, Jesus' words here suggest that peace is more about the

presence (not absence) of something even in a world of conflict and trouble. One of the great gifts Jesus gives to His Church is the gift of the Holy Spirit.

In John 7:37-39, we read: 'On the last and greatest day of the festival, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive. Up to that time the Spirit had not been given, since Jesus had not yet been glorified.'

The Holy Spirit, who is also referred to as the Comforter, is a river of living water flowing within us. No matter what is going on outside of us, we can have "peace like a river" flowing within us, through the gift of the Spirit.

God's peace is a gift; it is grace, undeserved, free from earning. This peace is beyond what we can control or manipulate with our minds. We cannot make peace happen. We cannot achieve peace or manufacture it. No, peace is a by-product of communion with God. If our goal is just to have peace, we may never receive it. If our goal is to be in communion with our loving Creator through Christ our Lord, peace is included as part of the restored relationship. The more grounded we are in God's presence, the more of His peace we receive from His gracious hand.

May you rest in the peace of your baptismal identity: a child restored and reconciled to the Father through Christ. May you receive and access the peace offered to you every moment by the power of the Holy Spirit. And may you continue to draw nearer to the Lord, that His peace may fill and saturate your soul, overflowing to words and actions of love and grace.

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

This letter and the attached card are sent to you as an invitation to prayerfully consider the ways God is leading you to support the mission of Jesus Christ at Hoffman Global Methodist Church in 2026.

The pledge card at the bottom of this brief letter is designed to help you pray and consider how you can take part in the ministries of Hoffman Global Methodist Church to spread the Gospel in the community of West Milton and beyond. In church finances we often talk about the tithe – 10%. I want to encourage you to not feel the pressure to jump to 10% right away, but to consider what a faithful “step up” looks like. Maybe that is going from 3% to 4%. The Lord blesses our steps of obedience and receives giving from a grateful heart.

The **General Fund** (“Budget Need”) is our default operations budget. It includes utilities, supplies, and staff salaries for the year. Your continued, faithful giving makes the ongoing and new ministries of the church possible. If **no** designation is marked on an offering, those gifts and donations are by default placed in the General Fund, our primary budget for the ministries of our church.

Missions are finances specifically designated to help other ministries and groups outside of our local church. So far in 2025, we have been able to bless a variety of ministries, locally and globally, with over \$16,000! This is made possible by funds designated for **Missions**.

Our Trustees manage the **Maintenance** and **Capital Improvements** line items, which focus specifically on the care of Hoffman facilities. Our facilities are an integral part of how we worship and serve God and His people. We have been blessed with a tremendous facility and *even better* people who take care of it, maintain it, and improve it when needed. On the board in the sanctuary, “Building Fund” records both the Maintenance and Capital Improvement giving from the previous week. While **Maintenance** is for the general upkeep of our facilities, **Capital Improvements** refers to larger projects that the church will need to take on to improve and update the facilities.

On behalf of the church board, I want to thank each one of you who is contributing to the work of Christ through the ministries of our church. Our time, our energy, and our financial gifts are three wonderful ways God invites us to join what He’s doing in the world and in the lives of people. We invite you to pray, talk to and listen to God, reflect, and dream about how you can serve the community and world through the ministries of Hoffman GMC.

Please know that these cards are between you and God. *Only the financial secretary will look at them, only so we can gather estimated figures and plan for the upcoming year of ministry.* You are not bound by anything written on this card. Let the Holy Spirit guide you as you envision what involvement in the church looks like this coming year.

*Please put your pledge card in the box provided at the front of the church by November 9, which will be **Pledge Sunday**. That Sunday we will have a time of prayer and blessing for your pledges and the work of the church.*

Support Your Church Through Your IRA Required Minimum Distribution

Are you over the age of, or approaching 70-1/2 and must take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) annually from your traditional IRA? This Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) is taxed as ordinary income.

Why not consider turning some or all of your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) into a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to your Church to fulfill all or part of your annual contribution, and/or for a special project? In so doing, the amount donated is excluded from your taxable income keeping your taxable income lower.

Qualified Charitable Distributions don't require you to itemize. Therefore, you may choose to take advantage of the higher standard deduction and still use a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) for charitable giving.

To make a Qualified Charitable Distribution, certain requirements must be met:

- You must be 70½ or older
- The maximum annual amount that can qualify for a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is \$100,000. Your spouse may also be able to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from his or her own IRA in the same tax year for up to \$100,000.
- Your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) can be made to one or more charities, such as the church, or IHN, or any qualified charity. You may also stipulate how you wish your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) be used by the organization you are supporting such as the Food Pantry or the Youth Program.
- For a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) to count toward your current year's Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), the funds must come out of your IRA by your Required Minimum Distribution deadline, generally December 31. However, it is wise to not wait to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) until the deadline date since the IRA Custodian needs time to process your request.

Tax reporting

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is reported as a normal distribution on IRS Form 1099-R for any non-inherited IRAs. While the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) amount is not taxed, you may not then claim the distribution as a charitable tax deduction.

To accompany your tax form, you will need a letter from the charity detailing that the gift came directly from your IRA custodian and that you received no goods or services in exchange for your gift.

Next steps?

Consult your tax or legal advisor. Then notify your IRA custodian you wish to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). **The Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) must be sent directly to the charity by the IRA Custodian.** If it is sent to you, it will be considered taxable income.

Transfer of Securities

If you contribute appreciated securities that have been held more than 12 months directly to the charitable organization, no capital gains tax is due and, generally, a charitable deduction for the full fair market value may be realized.
